THE REVD RICHARD WRITES The start of a new year gives us cause for reflection on the year that is past as well as on our hopes for the year to come. By any reckoning, 2013 was a good year for our Church. Firstly, we managed collectively to achieve something which had been longed for, but which had seemed almost impossible until the final fundraising drive in 2012: the new welcome area for our church has exceeded most of our expectations. The new space was needed; but a thing of beauty has also been created that will demonstrate its additional value with the passage of time.

The Archdeacon of Leicester presided at our inauguration service to give thanks for the completion of the extension on Advent Sunday to a good-sized congregation. But by definition this was a unique service, and comparison with other services of this kind are difficult. Comparison of the 2013 figures with those for the previous year suggests an encouraging trend. Nine Lessons and Carols 2012: 86; 2013: 115. Crib Service 2012: 56; 2013: 81. First Eucharist of Christmas 2012: 57; 2013: 70. One swallow – or even three – does not make a summer. But we have been praying for signs of growth for some time, and here is one encouraging result. Let us continue our prayers with even more fervour in 2014!

There will be challenges ahead. The most important of these will be the review of the Conventional District. We do not know what the outcome of this review will be, but two things are certain. We need to remain united in our objective of achieving a vibrant church at St Guthlac's with its own style of worship and caring community. We also need to be prayerful and continue to seek God's guidance in all our deliberations on the future and especially in the work of the new Worship Committee.

CREDIT UNIONS TO COMBAT THE EXPLOITATIVE PAY DAY LOAN INDUSTRY. The Archbishop of Canterbury has written to clergy individually reminding them of the damaging consequences of payday loans which carry excessive interest charges. What can churches do? Churches (and their members) can get involved in several ways that suit their range of resources and skills. The simplest place to start is to do some fact-finding: is there a credit union that covers your parish? Credit unions have fairly low recognition, so raising awareness of their presence in the community is key to encouraging more people to join. Individuals and corporate bodies (including churches) can invest money as savings. A local credit union may benefit from using your church premises as an access point for people in the community. Members in the congregation may have useful professional skills to offer, such as financial management or IT. A new Churches' Mutual Credit Union will be launched in the near future. If any member of the congregation has any experience or expertise in this area please contact the Revd Richard.
