

THE REVD RICHARD WRITES One of the things that used to happen in Sunday School but which certainly doesn't happen today because it is now distinctly out of favour is 'rote learning'. Rote learning or memorizing is out of favour because it denies the individuality of the pupil and his or her journey to knowledge. But in fact, you can do nothing in terms of learning a language without some rote learning. And the Bible has a language that speaks to us still today, whichever translation we use, so that a degree of memorization remains desirable. Without it, there is a danger that we are lost and float around without a firm Scriptural foundation. It is one of the most obvious differences between Christians and Muslims: Muslims can recall precise passages of the Holy Qur'an in a way we can't recall passages of the Old or New Testaments.

Yet in 1919 one Dr William Evans wrote a little book entitled *How to Memorize the Bible* which you can consult for free at http://memorizethebible.com/ (beware there is another website which tries to sell you the same book which is long out of copyright). Here is Evans' example from John 3:16. Choose the shortest passage that makes sense, he suggests, and then add to it, writing down the phrase as you do so.

God loved

For God loved

For God so loved

For God so loved the world

For God so loved the world, that he gave

'Is it not clearly evident that, by this method of procedure,' Evans observed, 'the matter is memorized without almost any perceptible effort? Try it, and see for yourself. You will really be surprised at your success. Be sure to *write* the words; it is not enough to merely repeat them aloud. *Write them.* Write. WRITE. This method must be adopted irrespective of the length of the selection to be learned. It may seem like a hazardous task, and almost too long to put into practice; but you will save much time in the end. What you have learned in this way will become your permanent possession.'
