**THE REVD RICHARD WRITES** The Baptism of Christ is a good event to celebrate on the first Sunday of Epiphany, and thus reasonably close to the New Year. Jesus made his choice to be baptized as an adult. Although in several of the mainstream Christian churches there is an assumption that baptism primarily concerns children, any time is a good time to become baptized. On one's own birthday, and the feast of the Baptism

of Christ, it can't get much better. So it is particularly appropriate that we have an adult baptism today and we are sure that this will be an important occasion both for our Church and for the individual who has chosen this path.

At Christmas I was given a copy of what may prove to be Billy Graham's last book, entitled *Nearing Home. Life, Faith and Finishing Well.* 'I never thought I would live to be this old', he writes (now at the age of 93, with significant hearing and vision loss). 'All my life I was taught how to die as a Christian, but no one ever taught me how I ought to live in the years before I die.' 'When granted many years of life, growing old in age is natural, but growing old with grace is a choice', he argues. 'Growing older with grace is possible for all who will set their hearts and minds on the Giver of grace, the Lord Jesus Christ.'

This shortish book might be depressing for some, but it's the greatest issue facing each and every one of us. 'It is never too late to begin building your life on the foundation of Jesus Christ and His will for your life...', Graham reminds us. Have you committed your life to Him? 'The most important decision you will ever make is to give your life to Christ and become His follower. Don't wait until life's storms begin to batter you; then it may be too late. Open your heart and life to him now. "Now is the time of God's favour, now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2).'

'If you have never invited Jesus Christ to come into your life, of if you are unsure of your salvation, I invite you to pause right now and ask Him to come into your life, to forgive you, and to save you – and He will. To help you make this commitment, I urge you to pray the following prayer right now (or something similar in your own words):

'O God, I know I am a sinner. I am sorry for my sins, and I want to turn from them. I trust Jesus Christ as my Saviour, I confess him as my Lord, and invite Him to come into my life today. From this moment on, I want to make Him the foundation of my life and to serve Him and follow Him in the fellowship of His church. In Christ's name I pray. Amen.'

That's also a great prayer of commitment for the one who is to be baptized. Billy Graham concludes *Nearing Home* with the words that 'it has been a great privilege for me to be an evangelist; my greatest joy has come from seeing people all over the world respond to the life-changing message of Jesus Christ.' 'Heaven is our hope, Heaven is our future, and Heaven is our home! I look forward to being home at last, and I pray you do also... When your hopes and dreams fall apart or people disappoint you or turn against you, turn your heart towards your Heavenly home. And when the infirmities and struggles of old age threaten to overwhelm you, turn your heart towards your Heavenly home...'

'Some reading this book may say, "But I rejected Christ my whole life. It's too late for me." I say to you, my friend, that was *then...* this is *now*. The Bible's promises were true then, they are true now, and they will be true forever. "Behold, *now* is the accepted time; behold, *now* is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2 NKJV, emphasis added)... Right *now* you can be certain that you are *nearing home*.'
