THE REVD RICHARD WRITES On 7 January, our PCC met with Louise Warner, Children and Families Officer of the Diocese, for a discussion on the subject of the Admission of Baptised Children to Communion before Confirmation. This is not an innovation. It has taken place in a number of parishes in this Diocese, including our own, since 1997. Two of our 'older young worshippers' were in the cohort of youngsters to be admitted to Communion last time this was carried out after an introductory course lasting some weeks. Slightly different Regulations were approved by General Synod in 2006, which require a new vote of the PCC on this matter: the decision to proceed once more with this policy was approved unanimously with one abstention at our last meeting. There is no requirement to seek formal consent from the congregation as a whole, but the PCC and I felt that it would be good to explain why we are proceeding with this policy now and what implications there might be for the future.

The main reason for proceeding now with this policy is that a number of parents of our children have asked for this as an option during an earlier consultation. Some of our youngsters are felt by parents and others in the church to be of sufficient maturity for the training towards admission to Holy Communion to be practicable. The initiative needs to come from the child and his/her parents: there is no obligation to request admission to Communion before Confirmation. Some may ask whether children of, say, eight or nine can understand the full significance of the Eucharist. To this there are two answers. Firstly, St Paul talks about 'discerning' or 'recognising the body of the Lord' (1 Cor. 11:29) rather than 'understanding'. Young children's formal understanding will grow as they partake alongside their parents and other adults. The adults may well find that their own 'discerning' is deepened as they receive alongside a child.

What implications are there for the future? The aim is that admission to Communion before Confirmation will take place later this year for some children. Others may follow in subsequent years. The hope is that children will continue to stay in the Church after the move from primary to secondary education and that they will then treat the process of Confirmation seriously in its own right when they feel themselves ready for this additional step along the Christian journey. But for all this to happen two things are needed. The first is that the children are welcomed and supported in their journey towards receiving Communion. The second is that after they have finished this stage of the Christian journey useful roles and an appropriate place for them will be found within the Church community. We pray for God's blessing and your support as a congregation for this endeavour. We must all look to our own understanding and knowledge of Holy Communion so that the children who have followed the preparation course do not end up with a better knowledge than our own!
