**REVITALISATION OF HOLBROOK MEMORIAL HALL.** Work started on the internal refurbishment on Monday 7 April and the first phase is nearing completion. This has involved a complete refit and rewiring in the kitchen, backroom and the toilets. The new decoration in this area makes it look very vibrant and clean. The next stage of the work will see the removal of a small amount of asbestos in the hall. Then in the summer holidays, the main hall will be rewired and the ceiling will be tidied up. The PCC has also approved the replacement of the main hall floor, which is breaking up quite badly and is becoming a safety hazard. This will happen later during the summer at a cost of about £13000 and will give us a new floor made of similar timber to the current floor, which will hopefully last another 100 years. There will be some fund raising events to help pay for this. Finally, we are thinking about a "Grand Opening" when all the work is completed. There's a lot going on! Our thanks to Steve Bowyer, Gary Ogg and the team working on the project.

**THE REVD RICHARD WRITES** When the announcement came on 20 May it was brief. 'The Bishop is pleased to announce the appointment of Revd Professor Richard Bonney as Co-Convenor of the Southern Edge Mission Partnership for a period of six months. He succeeds Revd Jennie Appleby and co-convenes with John Raven. This is in addition to his existing role and commences with immediate effect.'

What does it mean? The Mission Partnership contains seven churches at present including ourselves. The primary role of a Partnership Convenor is to be a powerful advocate and personal promoter for mission, growth and renewal. They are there to help ensure the Mission Partnership (MP) rigorously keeps effective Spirit-led mission as their key priority, and as a litmus test to which all possible activities and ways of working are held. They act as a 'first among equals', with the model being one of 'servant leadership'. They are authorised by the Bishop. There is considerable flexibility in how this might look in different partnerships, but in all places the Mission Partnership Convenor will:

- work collaboratively with ministerial colleagues to promote mission within the MP
- enthuse and motivate others to work together to promote mission locally
- cultivate an environment where colleagues (lay and ordained) learn from one another and cooperate with one another for the sake of mission;
- be mindful of the particular needs and aspirations of each of the member churches, so the missional vision of each individual church is considered as the wider MP vision is formed:
- ensure effective team-working, including levels of support and accountability.

At least, this is what it says on the 'Shaped by God' website. In addition, the Diocese is undertaking a review of the Shaped by God strategy that has underpinned much of diocesan planning and decision making since 2005.

### The Nine Marks of Mission

The initial Shaped by God document discusses these in much more depth, but in summary the nine marks are:

- lives and communities transformed, through the Good News of Jesus Christ;
- worship in a way that renews and inspires, echoing the praise of heaven;
- self-giving service to the community, because the Church is called to be local and outward looking;
- being rooted in prayer, because prayer is part of our loving response to the needs of the world:
- confident and sensitive evangelism, responding to Jesus' call to share our faith in word and deed;
- lifelong Christian nurture, because our mission overflows from our own discipleship;
- the welcome of newcomers, helping those who come close to the church to feel welcomed and cherished by God;

- becoming child friendly, following our Lord's example of putting children at a central place in His ministry;
- celebration of people and places, because godly celebration is at the heart of the gospel.
