REVITALISATION OF HOLBROOK MEMORIAL HALL. Work started on the internal refurbishment on Monday 7 April and the first phase is nearing completion. This has involved a complete refit and rewiring in the kitchen, backroom and the toilets. The new decoration in this area makes it look very vibrant and clean. The removal of the asbestos is now complete. In the summer holidays, the main hall will be rewired and the ceiling will be tidied up. The PCC has also approved the replacement of the main hall floor, which is breaking up quite badly and is becoming a safety hazard. This will happen later during the summer at a cost of about £13,000 and will give us a new floor made of similar timber to the current floor, which will hopefully last another 100 years. There will be some fund raising events to help pay for this. Finally, we are thinking about a "Grand Opening" on Remembrance Sunday 9 November when all the work is completed (Bishop Christopher and the City Mayor Peter Soulsby are coming). There's a lot going on! Our thanks to Steve Bowyer, Gary Ogg and the team working on the project.

**THE REVD RICHARD WRITES** The Church of England has introduced a new 'Course for the Christian journey' entitled 'Pilgrim'. Attractively produced, it has two stages, firstly the 'Follow stage', and secondly the 'Grow stage'. I thought it would be good to introduce some key points from the first four booklets that have been produced so far, which are in the Follow stage. The fourth is called '**The Beatitudes'**. Being poor in spirit means that we live in knowledge that we need God's help to live lives that are marked by patience, kindness, etc. and shaped by God's will... We cannot do it by ourselves.

Blessedness lies not in fighting for yourself but for others: hungering and thirsting for what is right can mean that we end up in conflict with those whose interests are tied up in what is not right. Jesus calls us to stand up with gentle dignity to those people and to continue to call for justice.

Praying for purity of heart is a prayer that God will untangle our complex inner conflicts so that we can, one day, stand and look at him face to face.

Being people of mercy means that we pay attention not to what we feel but what we do, and that we re-order our lives with actions of compassion and love.

Jesus calls us to 'seek peace peaceably'. This intentional peaceful search for peace reflects the deep character of God who always and everywhere seeks for peace in the world.

Seeking righteousness may mean that we encounter persecution, but this reminds us of the cross and the fact that, despite his own great suffering, Jesus rose again. In his ministry Jesus announced that the kingdom of God was near and called his followers to live as citizens of this kingdom. This means that God's rule of justice and mercy is breaking into the world and we should live as though this is a reality.

As citizens of God's kingdom we are called to live by values marked by God's reign. The Beatitudes summarize what these values are. True happiness – or the experience of knowing yourself to be blessed – is not a right but something that is given us by God as a gift.

The Beatitudes point us to the sure foundations upon which Christian lives can be built, and remind us that happiness lies in responding to the love God shows us.
