REVITALISATION OF HOLBROOK MEMORIAL HALL. Phases 1 & 2 of the work on the internal refurbishment, which were funded by **BIFFA**, are complete. The new floor for the main hall has now also been completed, with a grant of £3,500 from Leicester City Council, Knighton Ward towards the overall cost of the floor of about £13000. THE REVD RICHARD WRITES Two very different services are taking place at St Guthlac's this Harvest Sunday: our All Age Worship this morning and then, of equal importance, our Harvest Worldwide Songs of Praise at 4.30 pm this afternoon. Anyone who has watched the harvest being gathered in closely cannot fail to marvel at the change that comes over the landscape in just a few days as a result of the mechanisation of agriculture — and also to marvel at the size of the output from the fields, measured in the height of hay bales or lorry loads of grain moving to the local depot. Ours has been, remains, and will always be a generous God: but the spread of agricultural prosperity worldwide is hampered by other factors, especially climate change, and here it is important to note another event that is taking place in Leicester and elsewhere this Sunday: today is the Global day of Action for Climate Change. Christian Aid says: 'There are a million ways we can take action to change our world, build a safe, clean future and stand against the greed and wastefulness that fuel climate change.'

The Climate Coalition emphasises two important objectives. These are to

1. Make Climate Change a priority in the UK. This includes:

- Meeting all commitments in the UK's Climate Change Act, including medium-term targets as part of the fourth carbon budget.
- Making our electricity almost entirely carbon free by 2030 by moving to clean energy generation and phasing out fossil fuels.

2. Make Climate Change an international priority. This includes:

- A fair and equitable global deal to keep climate warming well below two degrees, with the UK backing an ambitious EU climate and energy package and a strong EU position in UN climate negotiations.
- Support for all elements of a fair binding, transparent international agreement that reflects both science and equity, including a phase out of dirty energy and phasing in a 100% clean energy future by 2050.
- Ensuring that the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) introduced to replace the Millennium Development Goals in 2015, reflect the need for urgent and ambitious action on climate change by integrating climate action across all relevant goals as well as including a specific goal on addressing climate change.

As Christians we have a responsibility to become better stewards of our environment. Let us pray earnestly for progress in this area this Harvest Sunday.
