THE REVD RICHARD WRITES

The exhibition has moved to the Town Hall and is erected outside the Lord Mayor's parlour as you go into the Council Chamber. Although the exhibition is behind security doors, a fair number of people have visited the area to see the panels.

Two weeks ago I briefly introduced the new feedback form that we will be using from now on to learn more about your reactions to our services. The Worship Committee will consider comments received at each of its meetings and will try to provide some response on occasions when this seems to be necessary. Our aim is to work consistently at ways to improve our worship.

Advent is here and with it the new Church Year (Year B in the Lectionary readings). What does liberation theology actually look like in 21st century Britain? How can the Church respond faithfully to issues like war, climate change and vast global inequalities? These are questions asked by the Revd Chris Howson in his book published in 2011 entitled *A Just Church*. 21st Century Liberation Theology in Action (also summarised in Magnet, Spring 2014, p. 34).

A 'fresh expression' church in the centre of Bradford has explored these questions through radical forms of worship, non-violent direct action (for example, physically resisting the unjust detentions of asylum seekers) and experimenting with new ways of being community that help to build the reign of God. Church members have been arrested, come under the scrutiny of security forces and been superglued together at the gates of hell (aka Aldermaston Atomic Weapons Establishment). This is their story: their successes and disasters, and their modelling of a new version of the Action/Reflection cycle called EARS (Education, Action, Reflection, Sustaining), aimed at helping other Christians to evolve their own way of thinking, growing – and demonstrating the relevance of Church in today's contexts.

I have asked for a number of copies of Chris Howson's article to be placed on the table at the back of the Church. In this he describes in more detail the EARS model which it seems to me could be of considerable interest and potential importance in developing and shaping the future ministry of St Guthlac's. Please take a copy and reflect on it, as well as making suggestions about possible changes for our consideration. The slips and pencils are also on the table at the back of the Church.

WARNING OF TELEPHONE SCAM Parcel Delivery Service. Royal Mail and the Trading Standards office are making people aware of the following scam: A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 66119** (a premium rate number, partially censored). If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £315 for the phone call. Please be aware that the premium rate number may change but nevertheless please do not call any number stated on a card from PDS. Please make sure your colleagues, family, friends and neighbours are aware of the above.
