THE REVD RICHARD WRITES World Leprosy Day was on 25 January. The Leprosy Mission is an international Christian charity with 140 years of experience. Through The Leprosy Mission's global family a population of 305 million people in around 30 leprosy-affected countries is served. Leprosy is a mildly infectious disease associated with poverty. It is easily cured. Leprosy starts by damaging the small nerves on the skin's surface resulting in a loss of sensation. Without the gift of pain, everyday activities are fraught with danger. Unnoticed burns and ulcers can lead to permanent disability. Due to the inability to detect grit in the eye, blindness is a common consequence of leprosy.

One of the things the Mission calls for, apart from our financial support, is our support through prayer. Here are some prayers from their prayer calendar. **26 January - 1 February** Pray for James from TLM as he visits the Danish Bangladesh Leprosy Mission in Bangladesh this week. Pray that plans for the new hospital building are progressing well. **2-8 February** Give thanks for our faithful supporters in the Isle of Man. Pray that they will enjoy a fresh expression of our work in the 'Island to Island' challenge and be inspired to continue supporting people affected by Ieprosy. **9-15 February** Pray for the 14th World Congress on Global Public Health, taking place in Kolkata, India from 11-15 Feb. Pray that The Leprosy Mission's voice will be heard and that the Congress will be pivotal in bringing about change which will influence governments, agencies and institutions around the world, to meet the challenge of improving people's health. **16-22**

February 20 Feb is World Day of Social Justice. UN Secretary General Ban Kimoon said, "The gap between the poorest and the wealthiest around the world is wide and growing. We must do more to empower individuals through decent work, support people through social protection, and ensure the voices of the poor and marginalised are heard." Give thanks for The Leprosy Mission's work around the world through which we strive to break the chains of leprosy, empowering people to attain healing, dignity and life in all its fullness. 23 February - 1 March Pray for TLM's Programmes Team as they attend meetings in Thailand to share experiences and best practice with other members of The Leprosy Mission's Global Fellowship. Pray that they will hear God's will for TLM and come away with lasting friendships. 2-8 March On International Women's Day (8 Mar) please pray for all women affected by leprosy, that they will be empowered to stand up for their rights and inspired to advocate for advancement. Pray for God's favour on TLM's work in these areas. 9-15 March Give thanks for The Leprosy Mission's presence at the 8th Annual Poverty and Social Protection Conference from 9-15 March in Bangkok, Thailand. Pray that best practice will be shared and that new approaches to poverty reduction and social equality will be developed. Give thanks also for the networking opportunities available to NGOs working in this field. 16-20 March Give thanks for Richard O'Brien's service as Disability Advisor at TLM-Myanmar. Pray that God will strengthen and sustain him as he returns to his life in the UK at the end of March. Give thanks that the Lord knows our every need before we even ask! 23-27 March Pray for the appeals being sent out over these three months; that they would touch people's hearts to continue to respond generously.
