

**THE REVD RICHARD WRITES** Today, the Southern Edge Mission Partnership (SEMP) pioneer minister, Ali Simpson-Smith, visits St Guthlac's. It's a good moment to take stock of the work that the Edge Project has been doing over the last six years with the support of the seven churches in the partnership including ourselves. This is the current position. More is expected once a sessional worker has been recruited.

Youth Café: 51 different young people attended at least once in the last quarter with a usual attendance in the 20s. There are currently 3 young adult leaders (Matthew, Tom and Laura), 2 adult leaders (Elaine and Sarah) and 3 young leaders aged 12 and 13. Some outside speakers have been invited. A 'ticket' system to encourage positive behaviour is proving a success. The young adult leaders have talked positively about the effect of their work on their own career development (e.g. possibly following youth work as a career choice).

Spaces: This is a new initiative providing a spiritual space for young people to run twice a month.

Football: The team remains undefeated and has reached the cup semi-finals. There has been a recent committee meeting and it has been decided to concentrate initially on developing a 'football family' for the lads as a precursor to developing a church in future. Curry and ministry nights are being planned. £700 remains of the original £4,000 from the Parish Mission Fund and as the football costs approx. £600 per season, funds will need to be raised. A Football Ministry evening with refreshments will be arranged (ideally at Nativity) where people from the SEMP churches can meet the footballers and leaders and see a presentation on the project. Sponsorship ideas will be proposed eg match ball or player sponsorship. Craig and Pat will confirm a suitable date in late May. A presentation was held at Nativity at which Craig met Tabitha and Reuben, who are involved with a football project in Zimbabwe and it is proposed to forge links between the 2 football projects, starting in a small way by sending out kits. There is potential for an exchange of visits in future.

Ali writes about how football ministry has helped change the life of one of our more recent recruits (called James for the purpose of this story). James is a 31-year old man who lives on one of the local estates with his girlfriend and their children. James, who knew a member of our team, would turn up to watch the games with a friend who had an alcohol problem. They would sit on the side-lines and cheer us on, throw

banter at the ref and the other team and generally offer advice on how they thought the game should be played – like most side-line players! What was different about these guys was that during the match they would sink at least 3 cans of lager – at 10 am. It was fair to say that for James life had become about drinking at the weekends... until one weekend when we were running short of subs and our manager – throwing a kit at him, suggested James step up to the mark and play. This was the beginning of a new chapter for him as he rocked the pitch and scored a hat trick in his first game against Enderby, landing us a win of 3 -1 and a place in the cup semi-finals! James was thrilled and said he wanted to join the team. The following week he scored another hat trick, this time against Melbourne Hall, then another goal the following week against South Leicester Churches. Since joining the team James has seriously cut down the amount of alcohol he consumes, turns up for training each week, is a valued member of our team and has started making positive changes in his life with his children and girlfriend. If he can do all this just through a relationship with us as leaders imagine how much more he could do with a relationship with Jesus!
