THE REVD RICHARD WRITES We know that Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church, is one of the most significant days in the Church calendar. The first Christians (before they even called themselves this) were waiting from guidance from the Holy Spirit, as had been promised by Christ. And then the Spirit came. And the faith was never the same again, but entered into a profound period of change and growth: the early Church became an organization peopled by people who from Antioch onwards called themselves 'Christians' (Acts 11:26). We need to recapture some of that transformative power.

In the *ABCs of Church Change*, the American pastor Karl Vaters writes that 'healthy churches need to move from a destination mindset to a change process'. What does he mean by this? His argument is that in a destination mindset, systems, facilities and methods become permanent parts of who we are and what we do. A building becomes our identity, or a method becomes our theology. But when a church implements a change process, we know what needs to be changed and why. 'When things never change, people think they never *should* change. Inertia becomes policy. But when things are regularly changing, change becomes part of the DNA of the church. Innovation becomes normal. **The ability to change is like a muscle. It grows stronger the more we use it.**'

So Karl Vaters pronounces: 'Change is healthy. Change is good. Change is normal. All living things change. Or they die. The church is no exception to that. No, we don't change the essential doctrines. They are our foundation. Messing around with the foundation doesn't bring change; it causes collapse... Just as churches that change the essentials will collapse, a church that isn't willing to change on non-essentials will die.'

Fear of change is no way to lead a healthy church, Vaters argues. 'Churches that seldom change never become good at it. Churches that have a regular process for change do it well – and healthily. **If you want your church to get used to making needed changes, change things regularly...** Stay firm on the foundations. Worship Jesus, honour Scripture and love people. On everything else, follow the ABCs. **Always Be Changing Something**.'

MEMORY CAFÉ FUNDING: SPARE FOREIGN COINS There are Memory cafés at St Guthlac's and St Thomas More where people with dementia and their carers can come for support, guidance and information in a friendly and supportive environment. St Guthlac's café (called Holbrook) meets on every 2nd Friday and St Thomas More café (called Knighton) meets on every 4th Wednesday of the month 1.30- 3.30pm. We have been running for over a year. Stimulating reminiscence activities are provided, such as Singing for the Brain, Arts & Crafts and other memory activities. The sessions also provide a really valuable opportunity for carers to meet and support each other. The cafes are run under the guidance of the Alzheimer's Society. They provide a leader, arrange visiting presenters, make contact with people needing assistance and give training for volunteers. The cost, for two cafes, is £250 a month. The first year's funding came from the Church Urban Fund (Near Neighbourhood Fund). We now need to find funding to continue.

As part of this funding drive, we would like to collect all spare foreign coins that banks will not exchange. If you have any coins please donate them and leave them in the box at the back of the church. We can arrange to convert them into sterling.
