THURSDAY MORNING HOLY COMMUNION. During the summer these services will continue as usual except for Thursday 20 August when Revd Richard is unavailable.

HANDS OF PRAYER

The young people of Bubbles recently considered 'prayer': what it is, why and how we do it.

The answer to the first ('what') from the group was beautiful in its simplicity; "it's talking to God". The 'why' brought up notions of saying "thank you", "sorry", "help for the sick", and many others.

For the 'how' we recalled that when we pray we bring our hands together and so we could use each finger on a hand to remind us of things we should pray for. Having personalised it by drawing around a hand each we 'allocated' a finger (with an indication of responses from the young people):

Thumb: the strongest digit - what/who means the most to us (parents; family)

Index finger: the 'pointer' - who guides us in our lives (teacher)

Middle finger: the tallest - who governs us and who should we pray for, for fairness (interestingly 'police' came out very strongly)

Ring finger: the weakest digit - who needs our prayers in society (sick; homeless)

Little finger: finally, ourselves - the smallest concern but nothing wrong in praying a bit for ourselves ('a little bit for me'; and nice to see 'a gerbil' make an appearance).

The children have put their 'Hands of Prayer' in their folders and can use them for contemplation at any time. A simple mechanism but perhaps a useful device for all ages. **MOTHERS' UNION** – a reminder that our Festival Service takes place on Tuesday, 28th July in St. Mary's at 2.30 p.m., followed by a Strawberry Tea in the Parish Centre.
