THE REVD RICHARD WRITES There's quite a lot happening in early September, so please pay particular attention to the Newsletter announcements. We can't list all these things in Church without the service getting too long and people becoming bored.

Please support our efforts and pray for those farming families in Malawi, many of whom belong to a local self-help group, the Kaporo Smallholder Farmers Association.

Those who enjoyed the welcome from the Shia mosque earlier this year will be pleased to welcome some of our friends back. We hope to make them feel as 'at home' in our Harvest service as we were in the mosque.

Finally, if you would like to join a fascinating tour of the Jain Centre in Leicester on Tuesday 6 October at 7pm sharp, please make yourselves known to Margaret or myself. The Centre closes at 8pm so the tour can only be a 'taster'.

CAN YOU RICE TO THE CHALLENGE? (excuse bad pun)

Harvest at St Guthlac's this year is a bit different. We're helping our Just Fair Trade shop in town raise money which will go towards the secondary education of young people in Malawi. And how do we manage this? By selling RICE – lots of it – over our Harvest weekend at church. We're taking up the rice challenge to sell 90 bags of rice, each weighing 1 kg, so that a Malawian farmer will be able to afford to send his child to secondary school for a year. We do hope you will come to church with purses open and ready to spend on this great cause – alternatively we can supply you with an IOU if you come without the necessary money on the day (about £2.70 per pack).

The rice is special too. It's Kilombero rice, a premium long grain aromatic white or brown rice grown in the Karonga area of Malawi. This is a remote district in the far north of the country, near the borders with Tanzania and Zambia. Over half the families there are headed by women who work their small farms assisted by their children, doing the majority of farming tasks by hand. Many belong to a local self-help group, the Kaporo Smallholder Farmers Association, which supports them with training and access to good quality seeds at wholesale prices – and also helps them get a fair price for their produce.

We are assured that the rice cooks easily without sticking together – but the best way to find this out is to get some and try it! And we'd love to hear how you got on, and also if you wouldn't mind sharing your best rice-based recipes with us, it would be great to start our own St Guthlac's Rice Recipes Book.

So the challenge to us this harvest time is to grow minds as well as bodies – by buying Kilombero rice, we will be giving young people in Malawi the opportunity to continue their education. We can, literally, 'eat someone out of poverty'! What a great target to aim for. Please support our efforts and pray for those farming families in Malawi.
