THE REVD RICHARD WRITES Today we welcome Mads Morgan and Ali Simpson Smith, who are contributing a presentation on the Edge Project and Pioneer Ministry. For the Edge Project, please read and 'digest' the sheet which accompanies the Newsletter this week. This is the restatement of the aims of the Project and why it continues to need our support.

Advent is the beginning of the Church Year for most churches in the Western tradition. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is the Sunday nearest November 30, and ends on Christmas Eve (Dec 24). If Christmas Eve is a Sunday, it is counted as the fourth Sunday of Advent, with Christmas Eve proper beginning at sundown.

The word **Advent** means 'coming' or 'arrival'. The focus of the entire season is preparation to celebrate the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Thus, Advent is far more than simply marking a 2,000 year-old event in history. It is celebrating a truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ whereby all of creation might be reconciled to God.

Advent symbolizes the spiritual journey of individuals and congregations, as they affirm that Christ has come, that He is present in the world today, and that He will come again in power. That acknowledgment provides a basis for 'Kingdom ethics', for holy living arising from a profound sense that we live 'between the times' and are called to be faithful stewards of what is entrusted to us as God's people. So, as the church celebrates God's 'inbreaking' into history in the Incarnation, and anticipates a future consummation to that history for which 'all creation is groaning awaiting its redemption', it also confesses its own responsibility as a people commissioned to 'love the Lord your God with all your heart' and to 'love your neighbour as yourself'.

Our hope cannot be in circumstances, no matter how badly we want them or how important they are to us. God's people experience physical existence in the same way that others do. Christians get sick and die, Christians are victims of violent crimes, and Christians are hurt and killed in traffic accidents, bombings, war, and in some parts of the world, famine. We can claim no special dispensation.

If our hope is only in our circumstances, as we define them to be good or as we want them to be to make us happy, we will always be disappointed. That is why we hope, not in circumstances, but in God. He has continually, over the span of four thousand years, revealed himself to be a God of newness, of possibility, of redemption, the recovery or transformation of possibility from endings that goes beyond what we can think or even imagine (Ephesians 3:20).

During Advent, we groan and long for that newness with the hope, the expectation, indeed the faith, that God will once again be faithful to see our circumstances, to hear our cries, to know our longings for a better world and a whole life (Ex 3:7) And we hope that as he first came as an infant, so he will come again as King!

HELPING OTHERS THIS CHRISTMAS

There are 3 ways in which members of the congregation are invited to support charities though St Guthlac's this Christmas:

- There will be a donation box available for those who would like to make a donation in lieu of giving Christmas cards to members of the congregation. This collection will go to help fund health clinics in Malawi, a scheme set up by Bishop Christopher.
- Our Christingle service in aid of the Children's Society will be on 13th Dec. Collection candles and envelopes are available and can be returned at the service or any time until Christmas.
- Gifts of non-perishable food will be collected at the Nativity service on 20th Dec and will be taken to Open Hands for their food bank. The delivery will be made after Christmas and given to individuals or families therefore tins and packs of everyday foods (especially tinned main meals, meat and fish, cereal and long life milk) rather than festive food are ideal. MALAWI RICE APPEAL This was more successful than we could ever have hoped, and thanks to the generosity of our congregation, and our visitors from the Shia mosque, we raised a magnificent £363 for Malawi. Of this, £243 went straight back to the Malawi farmers via the Just Fair Trade shop and £120 (pure 'profit' on the 90 bags of rice) has been sent to Bishop Christopher to help fund a monthly visit of a mobile health clinic to Mfula and Chamalala in Northern Malawi - villages which are so remote that they have no regular access to health care. We intend to continue to help Bishop Christopher with this vital work (see notice above).

FAIRLY TRADED CHOCOLATE STALL We raised a total of £168 for the Just Fair Trade shop and its fair trade producers. Many many thanks from me for your generosity in both of these recent fundraising activities. Margaret
