THE REVD RICHARD WRITES: One of the more interesting things about the Church of England is how slowly it brings about small-scale changes to its parish arrangements. Following upon the receipt of documents on 15 January, we are now asked to consider a draft scheme for the establishment of a parish of St Guthlac within the benefice of St Mary Magdalen, Knighton. A successor to the Revd Keith Magee will in due course become Vicar of St Mary Magdalen as well as of St Guthlac, Knighton. I shall be asked to resign as Chairman of the Conventional District as well as Minister and will be licensed instead as Minister in Charge to serve in the benefice of St Mary Magdalen, Knighton with specific responsibility for St Guthlac, Knighton. The change has been requested by the PCC of St Mary Magdalen, Knighton 'in order to enhance the mission and ministry of both churches as well as formalise current practice'.

The scheme does not alter the existing status of the church of Saint Mary Magdalen, Knighton. It makes provision for Saint Guthlac to become the parish church of the new parish of St Guthlac, Knighton. A new PCC will have to be formed for the new parish. Notice of these proposed changes is to be posted in both churches on Sunday 24 January, with provision that anyone may make representations for or against part or parts of the scheme provided that they do so

by Tuesday 1 March 2016.

We are asked to remind members of the congregation at services that this draft scheme exists so that people may inform themselves of what is proposed. Thereafter what happens depends on whether there are representations against the proposed scheme. If there are, there will be further consultations and delay. If not, the draft scheme will become 'the scheme', which will come into effect as soon as practicable.

No good news from the statistics. As a proportion of the population living within the dioceses of the Church of England (not including the Diocese in Europe), 1.8% attended a Church of England church each week in October 2014, and 4.3% attended at Christmas. As a proportion of the Christian population (estimated according to the 2011 census), 3.0% attended a Church of England church each week in October 2014 and 7.3% attended at Christmas. Note that the Statistics for Mission return gives no information about Christians who attend services offered by denominations other than the Church of England. In 2014, the Church of England carried out 130,000 baptisms and thanksgivings; 50,000 marriages and services of prayer and dedication after civil marriages; and 146,000 funeral services in churches and at crematoria/cemeteries. The trend over recent years shows a steeper decline in marriages and funerals than in church attendance. Since 2004, baptisms have decreased by 12%, marriages by 19%, and funerals by 29%. 12% of births during 2014 were marked by a Church of England infant baptism or thanksgiving service; 31% of deaths were marked by a Church of England funeral.

Christmas and Easter attendance trends fit the general picture, albeit with more variation year on year. Despite the decline, large numbers of people continue to attend church for these festivals: 1.3 million at Easter and 2.4 million at Christmas in 2014. Additionally, 2.2 million people attended special Advent services for the congregation and local community, and 2.6 million attended special Advent services for civic organisations and schools. Since 2012, the Statistics for Mission return has asked churches to report the size (and age distribution) of their worshipping community – those people who would be counted as regular worshippers. In 2014, the worshipping community of the Church of England was 1.1 million people, of whom 20% were aged under 18 and 29% over 70.

**SEMP EDGE PROJECT YOUTH CAFÉ** We have seen 74 different young people come through our Youth Café since we started back up after the summer holidays. We are now averaging 21 young people per week, and seeing at least new face every week. Although we currently have 5 young leaders working on a rota system, we really need more adult support for the sessions. If you are interested in helping out in any way, please get in touch! We really value your prayers, and would ask you to pray for us over the coming weeks. Please continue to pray for adult volunteers for the Youth Café, that relationships with the young people strengthen and grow deeper, and new opportunities for

conversations about the Gospel.
