THE REVD RICHARD WRITES: We are very fortunate as a Church to be led for our second Sunday in Lent by the Assistant Bishop of Leicester, Bishop Christopher. At its recent meeting the PCC agreed to make the Bishop's 'Mobile Clinic' in northern Malawi its foreign charity for the foreseeable future and a cheque from PCC funds will be presented to Bishop Christopher today. There is also a display of information about the work of the mobile clinic in the Welcome Area. Please note that individuals are welcome to support the mobile clinic at any time, in addition to the PCC's support. Please speak to David Hunt for details.

This Lent, Christian Aid suggests that we reflect each day on the blessings in our lives and in giving thanks. We are provided with a number of copies of **Count your Blessings 2016** which we can share as a personal journey or share with family, friends or the church community.

Asking the Lord

Jesus instructs us to pray for more workers in His vineyard. Throughout February the Church of England nationally is encouraging people to pray for every Christian to know how God is calling them (as the question is not is God calling me, but how is He calling me). This will include callings to short and long term vocations, to both those formally recognised within the life of the Church (like clergy, Pioneers, Readers, Pastoral Assistants and the like) and also, perhaps more importantly, those not recognised formally but which the vast majority of Christians are engaged in. It's about what happens at 11am Monday morning just 11am on Sunday mornings. Ministry and calling is about the 'overflow of the abundance of her hearts' so it was perhaps fitting that the day designated for the whole nation to pray for Leicester was Valentine's Day, 14th February! Please continue to pray especially during Lent that God will help each of us to recognise our calling. Within this, we do particularly pray for more people to be called to ordination: not because it is more important than other ministries, but because we have a shortage of those we need.

PROPOSED PARISH OF ST GUTHLAC, KNIGHTON Following upon the receipt of documents on 15 January, we are now asked to consider a draft scheme for the establishment of a parish of St Guthlac within the benefice of St Mary Magdalen, Knighton. A successor to the Revd Keith Magee will in due course become Vicar of St Mary Magdalen as well as of St Guthlac, Knighton. I shall be asked to resign as Chairman of the Conventional District as well as Minister and will be licensed instead as Minister in Charge to serve in the benefice of St Mary Magdalen, Knighton with specific responsibility for St Guthlac, Knighton. The change has been requested by the PCC of St Mary Magdalen, Knighton 'in order to enhance the mission and ministry of both churches as well as formalise current practice'.

The scheme does not alter the existing status of the church of Saint Mary Magdalen, Knighton. It makes provision for Saint Guthlac to become the parish church of the new parish of St Guthlac, Knighton. A new PCC will have to be formed for the new parish. Notice of these proposed changes is to be posted in both churches on Sunday 24 January, with provision that anyone may make representations for or against part or parts of the scheme provided that they do so by Tuesday 1 March 2016.

We are asked to remind members of the congregation at services that this draft scheme exists so that people may inform themselves of what is proposed. Thereafter what happens depends on whether there are representations against the proposed scheme. If there are, there will be further consultations and delay. If not, the draft scheme will become 'the scheme', which will come into effect as soon as practicable.
