THE REVD RICHARD WRITES: The shorter collect for today has these words: 'Risen Christ, your wounds declare your love for the world and the wonder of your risen life: give us compassion and courage to risk ourselves for those we serve to the glory of God the Father.' A MUSICIAN WITHIN THE COMMUNITY: KNIGHTON ORGAN STUDENTSHIP

It is proposed that the Parish of St. Guthlac's sets up a two-year organ studentship, starting, we hope, in autumn, 2016. The aim is to develop a musician within the community, by training someone to become an organist. This could be a school student with minimum Grade 4 piano, but someone older would be a distinct possibility and older people will also be encouraged to apply. The organ student will be someone who could become an organist for local churches. The proposal was approved in principle by St. Guthlac's PCC on 26th January. The project is being funded by Yolanda Courtney and the student will be overseen by Margaret Bonney. It will pay for an individual's organ tuition and all associated costs (music, exam fees etc.). The project will be taken forward by a small group reporting back to St. Guthlac's PCC. We hope to move into a recruiting phase soon. So, please pray for the success of the project, and please encourage anyone you know with keyboard skills, younger or older, to think about it.
