**THE REVD RICHARD WRITES:** The Archbishops have written to every serving parish priest in the Church of England expressing their longing "to see a great wave of prayer across our land, throughout the Church of England and many other Churches" from 8th-15th May. The week of prayer will culminate in 'Beacon Events' around the country over Pentecost weekend, where people will pray for the renewal of the Holy Spirit and the confidence to share their faith. In their letter the Archbishops said:

"At the heart of our prayers will be words that Jesus himself taught us — 'Thy kingdom come, thy will be done.' It is impossible to overstate the life-transforming power of the Lord's Prayer. It is a prayer that is reassuring enough to be on the lips of the dying and yet dangerous enough to be banned in cinemas. It is famous enough to be spoken each day by billions in hundreds of languages and yet intimate enough to draw us ever closer into friendship with Jesus Christ. It is simple enough to be memorised by small children and yet profound enough to sustain a whole lifetime of prayer. When we pray it with sincerity and with joy, there is no imagining the new ways in which God can use us to his glory."

"We long to see a great wave of prayer across our land, throughout the Church of England and many other Churches. Our hope is – for all Christians to deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ – for all of us to have confidence to share the Gospel – for all to respond to the call of Jesus Christ to follow Him as disciples, to live out the Gospel and to seek God's Kingdom from day to day At the heart of our prayers will be the words that Jesus Christ himself taught us – 'Thy kingdom come, thy will be done.' It is impossible to overstate the life transforming power of the Lord's Prayer... When we pray it with sincerity and with joy, there is no imagining the new ways in which God can use us to his glory."

The dream is this: imagine every Anglican, perhaps even every Christian, in this nation praying that prayer together with the specific intention that all may come to

know Jesus as Lord. We profoundly hope that you and those you serve will want to be part of this great movement of prayer. Evangelism is the work of God, and it begins as we seek him in prayer. It is always good for the Church to pray.

"Our Father in Heaven" "Our Father, who art in heaven" Through faith in Jesus we have the amazing privilege of becoming children of God, with a Heavenly Father who is good and who welcomes us into His presence. We are so precious to our Heavenly Father that He will never forget us. (Isaiah 49:15) "Hallowed be your name" "Hallowed be thy name" God's name is holy and we are to hold it in awe and respect. "Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as in heaven" "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven" God's Kingdom is established wherever people submit to His reign as King and carry out His will on earth, as it is done in heaven, "Give us today our daily bread" "Give us this day our daily bread" As the Lord provided manna in the desert on a daily basis for the Israelites so he has promised to provide for our needs as we bring them to him. "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us" "And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" Our sins, like a bag of rotting rubbish, "smell bad" to God and keep us separated from Him. However, because God loves us, he put our sins on Jesus, who never did anything wrong, so we could be put right with him (2) Corinthians 5:21). Having been shown such incredible mercy, we are to show mercy to others. "Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil" "And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil" When the devil tempts us he can dangle something that looks attractive in front of our eyes. If we take the bait and act on the temptation, before we know it we can be trapped and enslaved by chains of sin. Jesus leads us on the safe path through life. "For the Kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen" "For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen" All things, including each one of us, have been created to bring God glory. For now we catch glimpses of the Lord's glory but one day it will be different. One day we will see the Lord face to face in all of His glory, power and majesty when His kingdom is fully present.
