THE REVD RICHARD WRITES For some time now we have been supporting the mobile clinic project in Malawi with prayers and tangible financial support. We will be handing over a cheque to Bishop Christopher when he visits us on Advent Sunday. In the meantime, if you are able to make a donation please speak to one of the Churchwardens. We need every bit of help you can give us in order to make an impression on the terrible situation on which Bishop Christopher has recently reported. He writes:

From May to August the clinic has been making two trips a month. From September to conserve funds trips have been reduce to one a month. The big step change over this period has been the inclusion on each trip of 15 x 25 kg bags of Likuni Phala (LP). Likuni Phala is a vitamin and iron enriched maize flour given to pregnant women and the under fives who are at a particular risk and most seriously affected in times of famine. Back in May a 25kg bag cost £15.65 it now costs £19.38, almost 24% increase in less than six months. One bag feeds about 8 persons in this vulnerable category, which is about £2.42 per head. 3kg of Likuni Phala, which is what each receives, does not last very long.

'Canon Chifisi made repeated requests to include LP. We began by sending 10 bags. We are now sending 15. The decision to send LP was not easy. I knew it was going to put a huge hike on the cost of the clinic. However, it seemed that if we were offering health care to these remote villages it needed to be as holistic as possible. So we are trying to care for the most vulnerable – under 5s, pregnant women – during this time of extreme and acute food shortage. Fr Chifisi also gives talks on nutrition, sanitation and hygiene. As a result of his talks if villagers fail to build and use a pit latrine, rather than open defecation, they get fined by the Village Headman. This is a huge step forward in making their village a healthier and safer place to live.

This is all subsumed of course in that last April Malawi declared a state of national disaster. Today, 6.5 million people are going hungry, more than the total population of Scotland. Drought, erratic rainfall and devastating floods, a consequence of the El Nino, have led to a life-threatening situation. In the hardest-hit communities, desperate parents are cooking whatever they can find so that their hungry families have something to eat. Some are digging for mice and insects to keep them going. As ever, it is the youngest, oldest and the vulnerable who suffer most. Hundreds of thousands of pregnant women, breastfeeding mothers and young children are at particular risk of malnutrition. One report spoke of nearly 1 million children under 2 years in danger.

While food prices have been stable in the last few months they still remain abnormally high. Currently, a 50kg bag has nearly tripled in price since August 2015 making food access for low income households well-nigh impossible. Currently one trip of the Mobile Clinic costs £158 and treats around 200 people. This is an increase of just under 13% in six months but still treatment only costs around 79p per patient. Drugs: £59.86. Fuel: £69.42 Allowances: £28.72. When 15 bags of Likuni Phala are added (15 x £19.38) the cost per trip rises by just over £290 to £460/461 a trip.

Bishop Christopher concludes: 'I keep telling myself we cannot do everything but we can do something. What we do together is helping hundreds of people survive. Most importantly it gives them a sense of hope and the knowledge that others care. Currently we have sufficient funds to make trips through to the end of the year.' If you can help by adding to our next contribution to the mobile health clinic, please do so. And would you all, whatever your means, please hold this work in your prayers.
