THE REVD RICHARD is indisposed. As a Church we are pleased to welcome back Bishop Christopher, formerly Bishop of Northern Malawi. This report on Malawi was published by John Vidal on 15 November (in The Guardian of that date). 'Peter Phiri, a businessman in Lilongwe, Malawi, says: "It is always hot here but this year El Niño has made it worse. Last year, we had floods and we lost crops. This year, we had no rain. Two years of harvests have been hit hard and it has been disastrous for many people. Because 90% of Malwians are farmers, nearly half the country will need help with food.

"The lack of rain means we have water shortages and the rivers and lakes are low and the hydroelectric power does not work. There are long power cuts. People in rural areas do not have electricity, but in the cities this means homes and offices do not have air conditioning and people have no way to keep cool.

"Old people say it is hotter now than years ago but it is hard for me to tell. The rains are about to come and the temperature reaches 38C, 40C or more. Then it cools. One reason for the heat could be that people have cut down trees to make charcoal to earn money to eat, or to cure tobacco. Another could be climate change. The cities may be getting hotter because they are growing in size and people live in concrete houses.

"Over the past 10 years, people have noticed that the seasons are changing. In the past, the rains would come in October. Now it is November. The 'lean' season when people have less food to eat used to last three months. Now it starts early and lasts longer."

FIONA WINGATE: SELECTION FOR READER TRAINING

It is with very great pleasure that I take this opportunity to inform all members of this Church and the Church of St Mary Magdalen the good news that Fiona Wingate has been selected for training as Reader. The letter that she has received states among other things, that she is accepted onto the Reader Training Programme of the Diocese, delivered through the School for Ministry. She will receive a further letter in July with full details and dates of training. As a rough guide to the level of commitment, Reader training will involve an average of one Saturday / Sunday (day-time) a month and three Wednesday evenings a month (in term time). It is anticipated that all training will be held at St Martins House, Leicester. Since Fiona's training commences in September 2017 it is recommended that, in consultation with her incumbent, Fiona should begin learning and developing the practical skills of Reader ministry.
