THE REVD RICHARD'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE: 'This is a final distress call to the world. Save Aleppo' (13 December 2016). 2016 has been a terrible year for violence and loss of life, especially the lives of innocent children, as a result mostly of man-made human catastrophes. At times of distress caused by man's inhumanity to man, I have found it helpful to recall the words of the Prophet Isaiah in chapter 11:

The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them...

Henri Nouwen, whose words I often find of comfort, writes: 'The marvellous vision of the peaceable Kingdom, in which all violence has been overcome and all men, women, and children live in loving unity with nature, calls for its realisation in our day-to-day lives. Instead of being an escapist dream, it challenges us to anticipate what it promises. Every time we forgive our neighbour, every time we make a child smile, every time we show compassion to a suffering person, every time we arrange a bouquet of flowers, offer care to tame or wild animals, prevent pollution, create beauty in our homes and gardens, and work for peace and justice among peoples and nations we are making the vision come true. We must remind one another constantly of the vision. Whenever it comes alive in us we will find new energy to live it out, right where we are. Instead of making us escape real life, this beautiful vision gets us involved.' As Christians, our role is not just to think of the afterlife – inspiring though this should be to us – but to get involved in the world here and now, seeking to build God's kingdom and realize the Prophet Isaiah's vision of peace and justice here and now in this life.

ADVENT REFLECTION: LIGHT

The idea of light in the darkness resonates in the northern hemisphere where at this time of year it can feel as if the darkness is all consuming. Christ told his followers that he was the light of the world and that whoever followed him would have the light of life and will never walk in darkness. In Matthew's gospel Jesus goes further and challenges us by asking whether having lit a lamp we would hide it away and tells us quite clearly what we must do. Our light must shine before other people so that they will see the good things we do (through God's grace) and praise our Father in heaven.

"The mug was broken but we placed a torch inside and realised that the light could be seen, brightly shining through the hole. Isn't life a bit like that?" (Taize International Meeting, Budapest 1992). In this world where it would be easy to feel paralysed to respond to Christ's call to God in all people, Advent gives us the time to prepare again. In your preparations consider the questions

- What does it mean to be the light of the world?
- What is the light?
- How can you deliberately be a light to others?

Your £530 now ensures a full delivery of medicines and Likuni Phala in January.
