THE REVD RICHARD'S WRITES:

WISHING YOU ALL A JOYOUS NEW YEAR!

Firstly, a big thank you to all who have kindly stepped in to conduct services in my absence, to the churchwardens and to other members of the church who have worked to make things happen and to ensure that gaps are not noticeable.

I go for my next scan on 19 Jan, after which the next stage of the treatment will be determined. Apart from some minor inconveniences such as intense tiredness by 6pm, recovery so far seems to have gone pretty well. Colds and infections (so far) have been held at arm's length. Christians, whatever their denomination or precise spirituality, believe that our life here on earth should be a positive and enriching experience lived out joyfully. Apart from the consecration of the church, I found 2016 a rather joyless year, with too much ill-informed populist politics both here and in the US, the grinding inhumanity of the war in Syria, the ongoing child refugee crisis and our many social problems at home making for a combination of problems that was simply too much to take. Some predict that 2017 may be no better, and may be even worse in international affairs, but we can hold on to initiatives of goodwill in our prayers and focus on small, tangible steps to help to make the world and our own country a better place. If we emphasise our common humanity and love and service to others we can bring about measurable change. If we take care to find out about the needs and concerns of others, we may find that we can be of help to others in unexpected ways, but also bring a measure of fulfilment to us. Above all, if we greet one another with joy and a smile, that smile and that joy can become infectious. While others may hate, our task is to love. Others may try to deride us for our views but we remain firm in living the Beatitudes. So let us show others how we live our Gospel in love and truth and joy. My prayerful greetings to you all this
