

FEEDBACK FROM THE DEANERY SYNOD

You may, or may not, be aware that St Guthlac's is part of the City of Leicester Deanery which comprises most, if not all, Church of England churches from Scraptoft in the East to New Parks in the West, Beaumont Leys in the north to St Christopher's on in Saffron Lane in the south. The deanery is one of a number around Leicestershire. The purpose of the deanery is to support the churches, clergy and laity within the deanery. The deanery synod meets about 3 times a year at different parishes within the deanery and is formed of representatives of the churches. Each church can nominate 3 lay representatives to sit on deanery synod. At present I am your sole representative on the deanery synod.

What happens at deanery synod? It provides a useful opportunity to exchange information on a variety of subjects. Each meeting usually involves one or two presentations from different organisations or projects that may be of interest, a report back from the Church of England's general synod as well as a chance to learn something of the mission and ministry of the parish that is hosting the meeting. Some of the topics discussed at the last two meetings include:

- The work of the Cathedral Education Officer Andy Heafford in working with children and young people to make the story of the cathedral and Richard III more accessible to them and to introduce the themes of Christianity to them through these stories.
- An introduction to the Cursillo movement which is international movement
 that is focussed on prayer, study and action and provides a method to help
 Christians grow and share their faith. More information can be found on their

- Annual parish gift this is an opportunity to share with and hear from
 parishes about the challenges and successes they have and to celebrate the
 generosity of all churches in their contributions towards the diocese funding.
 Out of that funding comes the support functions such as the youth ministry,
 mission and ministry and training teams from which St Guthlac's have
 benefitted.
- The work of Launde Abbey as the diocese's shared retreat house. The
 presentation explained what opportunities and facilities exist for retreats and
 quiet days in the wonderful setting of the abbey.
- Deanery plan 2020: The deanery synod has also been instrumental in putting plans in place to try addressing the challenges of clergy numbers beyond 2020. The plan involved prayerful discussion and deliberation as to what the way forward might be and how that might be achieved.

The next meeting of the deanery synod will be on **Tuesday 7th March**, **7:30 pm** at Hope Hamilton church. Bishop Martyn Snow will be attending and using the chance to meet the lay representatives of the deanery synod as part of his getting to know the people in his diocese.

I would encourage you to consider getting involved with deanery synod because it is a wonderful opportunity to meet and share experiences with other Christians in the city of Leicester. I have certainly been encouraged when speaking to people to find out, "it's not just me" and then to listen to the ways they approached the subject. With resources running a bit thin on the ground the more we can share the better for all.
