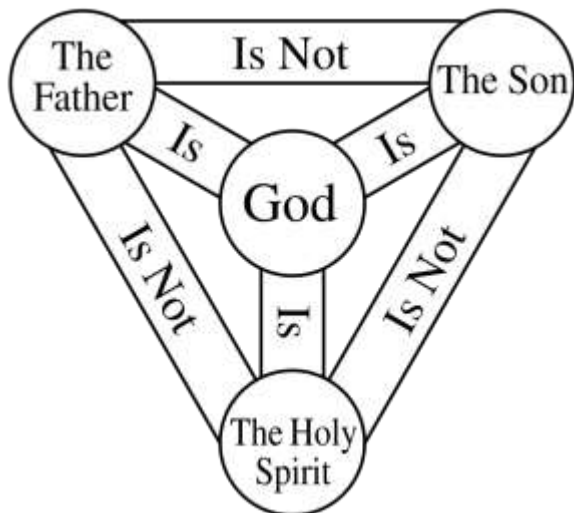

Tuesday 19th September 7.00pm Discussion on book Noughts and Crosses by Malorie Blackman

This is a book for teenagers and adults. The author, Malorie Blackman, was Children's Laureate 2013 -15. The story takes place in an alternative Britain. Sephy and Callum have been best friends since childhood. But they live in a segregated society. Callum is a nought, a second-class citizen, in a world dominated by the Crosses. Sephy is a Cross, and the daughter of one of the most powerful men in the country. Their world, like ours, is full prejudice, racism, distrust and mounting terrorist violence. Despite all this, a romance builds between the two friends, which could lead both of them into terrible danger . . .

Based on a true story, Philomena (Judi Dench) became pregnant as a teenager in Ireland in 1952. She was sent to the convent of Roscrea to be looked after as a "fallen woman". When her baby was only a toddler, he was taken away by the nuns for adoption in America. Philomena spent the next fifty years searching for him but with no success. Then she met Martin Sixsmith (Steve Coogan), a world-weary political journalist who happened to be intrigued by her story. Together they set off to America to try to find him.....
