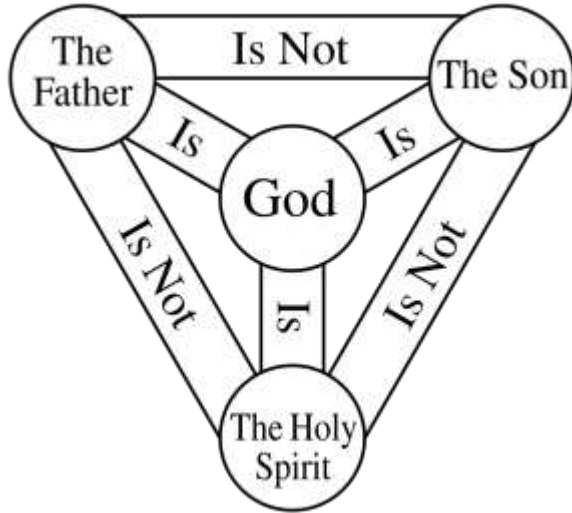

UPDATE ON BABY BEN

Some of you may have been wondering who Ben is since he appeared on the prayer list a few weeks ago. Ben is our unborn son who is due mid November. He will be our first born and we found out at his 20 week scan that he has Spina Bifida. This is a condition affecting the spinal cord, which normally fully closes around 17-20 days after conception. Ben's spine remains unfused at the lower end of his spine, which may affect his ability to walk and to have normal bladder and bowel function. So far his MRI scans have remained stable and we won't know the full extent of his abilities until he is born. He will need an operation within 5 days of his birth at QMC, Nottingham.

My husband, Dan and I would like to thank you for praying for us all as we prepare for what lies ahead. It has been a great comfort to us all. Amy and Dan

Based on a true story, Philomena (Judi Dench) became pregnant as a teenager in Ireland in 1952. She was sent to the convent of Roscrea to be looked after as a "fallen woman". When her baby was only a toddler, he was taken away by the nuns for adoption in America. Philomena spent the next fifty years searching for him but with no success. Then she met Martin Sixsmith (Steve Coogan), a world-weary political journalist who happened to be intrigued by her story. Together they set off to America to try to find him.....

There will be the chance to discuss the film informally after the showing.

Tuesday 14th November 7.00pm Yolanda Courtney 'A zeppelin flew gaily over my house.' This talk will be a miscellany of memories and memorials in letters between Yolanda's great great grandfather and his cousin. Yolanda will talk about the home front during World War One and her visits to memorials at home and away in these hundredth anniversary years. Its a miscellany but of course many people had mixed experiences during World War One rather than being always in combat in a trench.
