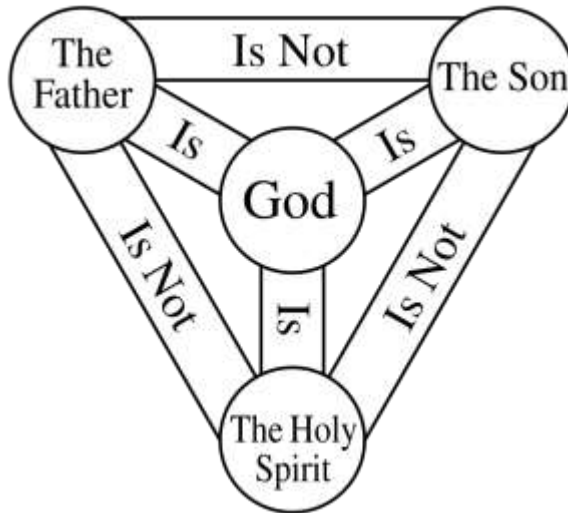

UPDATE ON BABY BEN

Some of you may have been wondering who Ben is since he appeared on the prayer list a few weeks ago. Ben is our unborn son who is due mid-November. He will be our first born and we found out at his 20 week scan that he has Spina Bifida. This is a condition affecting the spinal cord, which normally fully closes around 17-20 days after conception. Ben's spine remains unfused at the lower end of his spine, which may affect his ability to walk and to have normal bladder and bowel function. So far his MRI scans have remained stable and we won't know the full extent of his abilities until he is born. He will need an operation within 5 days of his birth at QMC, Nottingham.

My husband, Dan and I would like to thank you for praying for us all as we prepare for what lies ahead. It has been a great comfort to us all. Amy and Dan
