Leadership at St Guthlac's

Every voice is important: Please help through your prayers & your views.

Over the next few months we need to be thinking about the abilities, skills and interests needed to support the worship and mission at St Guthlac's in the future. The PCC has agreed that David, Tina, Jane and Lesley (the Standing Committee of the PCC) should meet with Adrian to begin to develop a Parish Profile. The first step is to clarify the current work of St Guthlac's and what we hope to achieve in the future. The group's first meeting will be on 25th October.

As soon as we have a draft of the initial ideas, these will be shared with the congregation. We hope you will then let us have your thoughts either in person or you may wish to jot down your ideas and let us have them. We aim to have a clear idea of what we all hope St Guthlac's will do in the future by 21st January when Archdeacon Tim will come to take the communion service and talk over our views. Following this we will think about the sort of person needed by St Guthlac's to help us achieve our aims. REDEDICATION OF THE ORGAN during the communion service on **Sunday 29th October 10.30am**. St. Guthlac's has had its organ improved, including removal of clatter and a thorough correction of faults; we have a new adjustable organ bench and the pedal board is now at a standard distance from the manuals. We are told that it is now good for a further 40 years (at least!) and people have been commenting on the improved sound. The priest and preacher will be Canon Dr Stephen Foster. The organ builders and other guests will be coming and Geoffrey Hames and his teacher, Roxanne Gull, will be playing the organ. The joint choirs of St. Mary's and St. Guthlac's will be singing a psalm setting by Charles V. Stanford and some favourite hymns. The anthem will be "Christ is the World's True Light" by W. K. Stanton (Yolanda's great uncle). All are welcome to join us for this special occasion.

REMEMBRANCE: THOUGHTS FROM HOME **Sunday 12th November 5pm** at St. Guthlac's, continuing our series of words and music to mark each year of the Great War. This year we focus on those left behind and the letters they wrote to the men at the Front.
