Leadership at St Guthlac's

Every voice is important: Please help through your prayers & your views. Over the past month David, Tina, Jane and Lesley (the Standing Committee of the PCC) have met twice with Adrian to begin to develop a Parish Profile. As a first step they have been considering the current work of St Guthlac's; our abilities, skills and interests as well as the things we would like to improve, to support the worship and mission at St Guthlac's in the future. From this they have produced a SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats). This has been seen by the PCC and we would now welcome your comments on this analysis.

You should have received a copy of the SWOT analysis and we would be grateful if you could add your comments to the sheet and then return it to the box in the welcome area by **Wednesday December 20th**; you may add your name if you wish but it is not necessary.

We aim to have a clear idea of what we all hope St Guthlac's will do in the future by 21st January when Archdeacon Tim will come to take the communion service and talk over our views. Following this we will think about the leadership needed by St Guthlac's to help us achieve our aims. We plan to do this in consultation with the congregation by Easter.

There will also be special opportunities to pray for guidance as part of three Advent prayer meetings, see below for dates.

ADVENT REFLECTIONS: Advent provides a time to reflect and prepare. On one level we prepare for the coming of Christ as an infant but also for his coming again. This year Advent gives us, the family of St Guthlac's, a chance to reflect and prepare for a new phase of our journey in Christ in this place. As a church we need to be thinking about where God is calling us and what is important to us in our Christian life. The Churchwardens and PCC have started the process but it is important that all of us take time to think carefully and prayerfully about this.

To support this very important work our Advent reflections will this year allow time to focus on the future direction and leadership of St Guthlac's using the themes of HOPE, LIGHT and JOY. They will be a short service of readings, prayer and time to think. Please do try to come one:
