Leadership at St Guthlac's

Every voice is important: Please help through your prayers & your views. Over the past month David, Tina, Jane and Lesley (the Standing Committee of the PCC) have met twice with Adrian to begin to develop a Parish Profile. As a first step they have been considering the current work of St Guthlac's; our abilities, skills and interests as well as the things we would like to improve, to support the

skills and interests as well as the things we would like to improve, to support the worship and mission at St Guthlac's in the future. From this they have produced a SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats). This has been seen by the PCC and we would now welcome your comments on this analysis.

We aim to have a clear idea of what we all hope St Guthlac's will do in the future by 21st January when Archdeacon Tim will come to take the communion service and talk over our views. Following this we will think about the leadership needed by St Guthlac's to help us achieve our aims. We plan to do this in consultation with the congregation by Easter.

READER TRAINING UPDATE You may know that I have been selected for Reader training and that St Guthlac's are generously sponsoring my training Finally after a nearly a year of waiting my training has started and is proving interesting and challenging in equal measure. The course runs over two years. This year it involves three evenings and one full Sunday a month and in the New Year I will do a placement at another parish. This placement may last between 4 to 12 weeks so I will not be around much at St Guthlac's during that The training covers a wide range of subjects. My first assignment involved each of us thinking about the parishes in which we live, work and attend church; what they're like in terms of character, facilities, demographics, needs, challenges and opportunities and how we fit into the picture. It has been a really fascinating exercise especially given that these are the same questions we at St Guthlac's are asking ourselves as we prepare to find a new minister for the next phase of our journey. It also reminded me that these are questions not just for the church leaders but also for all of us. It led me to think about the parish around me and I would encourage each of us to do the same and consider the areas we live and the people we meet. Are we aware of the people around us in our daily lives and what their needs may be? What do we notice about the areas where we live? How have they changed? What opportunities exist to live out and share our Christian faith in this changing landscape? With all these thoughts to consider I am off to start the next assignment -prepare a bible study on a chapter of the Book of Revelations... I will keep you posted. Fiona
