UPDATE ON READER TRAINING With two terms of the first year already completed time is passing rapidly. The course remains very interesting and challenging. Since my last update we have had a number of sessions looking at the question of how hospitality can support God's mission and why it is a central Christian principle. I am presently working on an assignment about just that question. We have also had a couple of sessions on the question of Spiritual Discernment. The title sounds grand and can put people off, but it is simply the question of how do we as Christians and the church make decisions? How do we discern what God is calling us to do?. During our studies we were challenged to think about how we chose between good and good, because often within churches we're discussing which good idea to take forward because we need to consider our passions, our gifts, the opportunities and, not to be forgotten, our wellbeing. The main focus points in the new term will be on preaching and a placement.

For the next six to eight weeks I am doing my placement at Great Bowden, near Market Harborough, under the supervision of the vicar, Rev Bryony Wood. I will be getting involved in a number of different areas including their regular weekday morning services, a couple of monthly services in the church for the local primary school as well as some baptism workshops and finally will be working with vicar to prepare and assist at a baptism service. I also hope to have the opportunity to meet some of the other Readers in the Harborough group of churches to explore what Reader ministry means for them. It will be a busy few months, but I am looking forward to it. The flip side is that I won't be around in church very much during this period but St Guthlac's will very much be in my thoughts and prayers. I would like to ask you to hold me in your prayers during this placement, so that it might be a fruitful time. Many thanks. Fiona

TEA & TALK 'Gargoyles and grotesque carvings of Leicestershire and Rutland' on Tuesday 22nd May 2018 at 7pm

Leicestershire's churches contain a wealth of ignored medieval sculpture in both stone and wood depicting a wide variety of subjects including grotesque beasties, so-called 'Green Men' and even rather rude contortionists. This talk will introduce you to the sometimes weird and often wonderful medieval carvings in the churches of Leicestershire and Rutland, including grotesque gargoyles, contortionist corbels, scary springers and hideous hood stops.

Bob Trubshaw has been researching and writing about local medieval carvings for about thirty years. He is the author of numerous books and articles about local history, folklore and archaeology. All welcome, no charge!
