SUSPENDED: An Artist's Journey by Arabella Dorman, Wednesday 4th July at 7.00 pm, Leicester Cathedral. Arabella Dorman will talk about the journey that led her from Iraq and Afghanistan as an embedded war artist, to her humanitarian work in Lesbos, Palestine, Syria and Lebanon, and the creation of Suspended. an installation artwork which is on display in Leicester Cathedral from 20th June (World Refugee Day) to 28th August. Composed of hundreds of items of clothing discarded by refugees upon their arrival on the island of Lesbos, a 'stilled explosion' will be created over the Cathedral nave, inviting the viewer to contemplate the violent fragmentation experienced by the inhabitants of the garments. Suspended will be the centrepiece of a unique summer of events. which it hopes will help people grasp the experience of real refugees and promote empathy for those individuals. An interactive wall of clothing and shoes salvaged from Lesbos and Calais will also be in place with an invitation to touch and handle the clothes, and to imagine the lives of the individual men, women and children who have worn them as they risk everything to escape the violence of their homeland.
