UPDATE ON READER TRAINING. The school holidays are here and this means that my first year of training has come to an end and I suddenly find myself with only one year left to go. Come the new term in September I will be among the “seniors” on the course. How time has flown. It’s proved an interesting and challenging year in equal measure as it has introduced me to new ideas about subjects like creation care i.e. how does our faith inform our care of God’s creation, and has expanded and developed my understanding of the key doctrines of the church such as the trinity. During the course we have looked at questions of how do we as Christians make decisions - is it the will of the majority or is it by consensus until it is felt that “it is good for me, it is good for you and it is good by the Holy Spirit”. We have explored the ways of preaching and the pitfalls to avoid and have begun to gain an understanding of loss and how it might manifest itself in those we may serve in the future. One of the greatest pleasures has been studying alongside people who come with their own and often very different stories. I think the most important lesson I have learnt this year is that we learn so much if we take time to get to know people and to be willing to hear and listen to what they have to offer. So for now I will enjoy a two month break free from assignments. But I do want to say thank you, to everyone at St Guthlac’s for your encouragement and support it has carried me through those times I wondered what on earth I was doing. RIDE AND STRIDE - 8th September. The annual Leicestershire Historic Churches Trust funding raising event takes place on the second Saturday in September. Last year the event raised £38,800 to support historic churches in the county and city. Cyclists, walkers, runners, joggers and mobility scooter drivers seek sponsorship for visiting a number of churches or chapels on the day. Recorders and welcomers at St Guthlac’s are also eligible for sponsorship for their hours on duty. The money raised by each participant is shared equally between the Christian Church nominated by the sponsored participant and the Trust. Around 400 Christian place of worship are usually open. Participants plan their own routes using the supplied list of church and chapels that have registered as opened. It’s a great way to explore the amazing medieval churches and try a bit of gargoyles spotting.

Once again **St Guthlac’s will be open from 10am to 6pm and we’re looking for volunteers to welcome visitors.** If you’re able to spare an hour on the day please do sign up on the rota at the back of church.
