We give thanks for the recovery of **Canon Chifisi** and for his work in Malawi. The PCC has recently sent a cheque to Bishop Christopher from our donations and fundraising and here is an extract from Bishop Christopher's response:

"Thank you for your cheque for £1200 from St Guthlac's which has arrived safely. I will send a letter of thanks on my return from holiday on the 16th September. I go to Malawi on the 9th and return to the UK on the 19th October. My main focus will be to meet with the Bishop and Canon Chifisi to have discussions on the continuing life of the mobile clinic, its future and development. In conjunction I hope to hear as much as is available about the proposed rural hospital in Mfula, plans and timetable etc.
