MEMORIES OF TERRY COCKS

It is with great sadness that we have to announce that our friend Terry Cocks died on Wednesday 19th September 2018.

Terry and I go back a long way. I first got to know Terry when I joined the choir at St. Guthlac's in 1966. I had seen Terry cycling around the neighbourhood (he never learnt to drive) and seeing someone I knew at church made me feel very comfortable, Terry always made everyone feel comfortable. At this time Stanley Coggins was Priest-in-charge at St. Guthlac's, but as I discovered later, Terry had worked with other curates in Knighton. Terry was always there for St Guthlac's; he would take services if needed when Stanley was not available. He served on numerous St. Guthlac's committees, worked with most of our Priests-in-charge and was a Warden of the Church. Whilst our Priests-in-charge came and went, Terry was always there and he knew the congregation and the congregation knew him.

Ultimately, Terry was called to higher office as an Honorary Lay Canon of the Cathedral and from that time he divided his time between the Cathedral, St. Mary's and St. Guthlac's. Terry was a regular at the 8:00am Holy Communion when it was held at St. Guthlac's and he was regularly seen at the Matins service right up to July. Terry loved history and was very knowledgeable about local history. He wrote "Past and Present", a history of the Parish of Knighton and was working on our latest World War 1 Project.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to Felicity and Rosemary at this time as they face the loss of a husband and brother. St. Guthlac's has to come to terms with the loss of a loyal servant and I have to come to terms with the loss of a very good lifelong friend. Rest in peace, Terry.
