AN OFFICIAL WELCOME TO A FAMILIAR FACE! Many of you have told me how much you appreciate the ministry of the Revd Canon Dr Stephen Foster in leading and presiding at services and also in providing pastoral support. I'm pleased to say that Bishop Martyn has agreed to give Stephen his Permission to Officiate in the diocese, with immediate effect once Stephen retires from the University Chaplaincy in February.

I'm also *very* pleased to report that Stephen has agreed to make our benefice the focus of his ministry after retirement. This means that he will work alongside me (and Fiona Wingate when she is licensed as a Reader in the autumn of 2019) in a Benefice Ministry Team. Stephen, like Fiona, will have a focus on St Guthlac's but will also be ready to lead worship at St Mary's, whilst my focus will be on St Mary's but also supporting St Guthlac's. Our new arrangement will give us the benefits of team ministry as well as ensuring on-going support for the life of both churches. Both our PCCs have discussed and enthusiastically supported Stephen's new role and our thinking about ministry across the benefice, which will help our partnership in mission to grow whilst still maintaining the character and independence of the two churches.

After this morning's service here at St Guthlac's we will share some wine and cake (as well as coffee!) to mark Christ the King Sunday, the final Sunday in the Churches calendar. I will take the opportunity to say a little more about our team approach and to answer any questions you may have. Do please stay if you can. Adrian

ADVENT REFLECTIONS: 9:30am Friday 7th, 14th, 21st December. The season of Advent gives us a time to pause and prepare ourselves for the coming of the Kingdom of God. It allows us time, once again to consider what that means for each of us in our lives. Advent reflections provide a space and time for reflection and prayer; using the opening part of John's Gospel as the basis for our reflection. It should last no longer than 30 minutes. Fiona

READING AND PRAYING THROUGH ADVENT: many people find that the hectic business of the weeks before Christmas need to be balanced by a regular diet of reading and praying, so that our spiritual preparation does not get forgotten. There are a number of good books and prayer guides available at the Christian Resources shop in St Martin's House, by the Cathedral. If you would like to read in parallel with me and others in the church through Advent then you might like to use "Waiting here for you: an Advent journey of hope" by Louie Giglio. Each day we are given a short Bible reading, a reflection and meditation and a prayer, on the theme of waiting and anticipation. The readings start on Monday 26th November. Adrian

THANKS to all involved in our Commemoration of the World War One Centenary and Remembrance Sunday: I would like to thank everyone who took part in the series of events and services around this year's Remembrance Sunday and the hundredth anniversary of the end of the First World War. It was a truly remarkable week and culminated in a very special Sunday.

Our exhibitions last weekend drew more than five hundred people, and almost four hundred children from local schools came to St Mary's during the week to experience craft workshops with a focus on remembrance and our local servicemen. We had many visitors for our Remembrance Day services and a full house of three hundred for the evening Son et Lumiere, 'The Price of Peace'.

Together with other talks, concerts and events at both churches, not to mention the 'Knighton Remembers WW1' book, we presented a very impressive range of ways to remember and honour the fallen, especially those of WW1. The universal response of those from our community who came to share our events, was of appreciation and often amazement at the level of skill and hard work that had been put into each occasion.

Once again many, many thanks to the organising groups and all the individuals who put in the work to make the whole week such a memorable success. Adrian
