AN OFFICIAL WELCOME TO A FAMILIAR FACE! Many of you have told me how much you appreciate the ministry of the Revd Canon Dr Stephen Foster in leading and presiding at services and also in providing pastoral support. I'm pleased to say that Bishop Martyn has agreed to give Stephen his Permission to Officiate in the diocese, with immediate effect once Stephen retires from the University Chaplaincy in February.

I'm also *very* pleased to report that Stephen has agreed to make our benefice the focus of his ministry after retirement. This means that he will work alongside me (and Fiona Wingate when she is licensed as a Reader in the autumn of 2019) in a Benefice Ministry Team. Stephen, like Fiona, will have a focus on St Guthlac's but will also be ready to lead worship at St Mary's, whilst my focus will be on St Mary's but also supporting St Guthlac's. Our new arrangement will give us the benefits of team ministry as well as ensuring on-going support for the life of both churches. Both our PCCs have discussed and enthusiastically supported Stephen's new role and our thinking about ministry across the benefice, which will help our partnership in mission to grow whilst still maintaining the character and independence of the two churches. *Adrian*
