Paying these back is taking money away from the healthcare that is so desperately needed to tackle death in childbirth. The petition the UK Government to use its power in the International Monetary Fund to: • Ensure all Sierra Leone's debts on the loans it received for fighting the Ebola outbreak are written off. • Take urgent action to prevent new debt crises in developing countries and tackle them effectively when they arise.
