SUMMER READ: Now or Never by Bali Rai and / or An Elephant in the Garden by Michael Morpurgo

We hope you will join us in reading Now or Never by Bali Rai and/or An Elephant in the Garden by Michael Morpurgo over the summer. Both these short books, aimed at teenagers and adults, explore World War II issues from less familiar points of view. You might like to read one or both.

There will be an opportunity to meet to discuss the book on **Tuesday 17th September** (with tea & cakes). You can either borrow the book for a small donation or buy a good quality secondhand copy. See Tina or Lesley if you want a copy.

Now or Never tells the story of Private Fazal Khan who leaves his home in India to support the British in World War II. As events in France take a turn for the worse with a journey to the evacuation zone in Dunkirk, Fazal starts to question why he is even there and why he is expected to be loyal to a king whose people don't all see him as their equal. (approx £5 to buy) 'An Elephant in the Garden' takes place in Dresden, 1945. Elizabeth and Karli's mother works at the zoo, where her favourite animal is a young elephant named Marlene. The zoo director tells her that the dangerous animals — including the elephants — must be shot before the town is bombed. Unable to give Marlene up, their mother moves her into the back garden to save her... and then the bombs start to fall. (approx £3 to buy)

ST. GUTHLAC'S ORGAN STUDENT SCHEME

St. Guthlac's first organ student has successfully completed his three years with us. Geoffrey Hames achieved his Grade 4 Organ examination last year. He will continue to play at St. Guthlac's on a monthly basis and we understand he is also having requests to play at other churches, which is wonderful.
