HERITAGE WEEKEND at St Guthlac's: 14-15 Sept 2019

Fired up with enthusiasm after the Tea and Talk we had from Richard Gill about the Arts & Crafts movement and its influence on the building of St Guthlac's and other properties around Knighton, I thought it would be a good idea to let more people know about this little gem of a church we have! What better opportunity to do this than to open it to the public during some of the Heritage Open Days this September?

For quite a few years now, English Heritage have encouraged the opening up of places which are of historic interest but aren't usually accessible to the general public – this takes place annually during September. They offer free publicity and support by way of marketing to organisers and all they ask in return is that a building is made open for a particular time with people around to welcome visitors – a bit like the Ride & Stride scheme, but without sponsorship! I have been around many such historic places in Leicester – now occupied by businesses, solicitors' offices, banks – and it has been a revelation. Gradually, more buildings have come on stream, so that what started as one weekend of openings now extends over 2 weekends and the week in between.

So for the first time, St Guthlac's has become part of this scheme, and we have an entry on the Heritage Open Days website and I hope we'll be able to welcome many visitors over the course of 14-15 Sept. On Saturday 14 Sept, it coincides with Ride & Stride, and we should receive a double whammy of visitors (I hope). On Sunday 15 Sept, we'll be opening the church from 12.30 to 4pm to the Heritage visitors. I have prepared a short booklet on the history of the church which will be available on the days so that our visitors can have a self-guided tour of the building. I'm very grateful to all those who have signed up as welcomers during the weekend, and I hope it becomes an annual event for St Guthlac's. Margaret Bonney
