Readings for Creationtide 3 from the Inclusive Bible

Proverbs 8.1-31

Doesn't Wisdom call? Doesn't Understanding raise her voice?

² On the hills along the road, at the crossroads, she takes her stand; ³ beside the city gates of the town, in the gates themselves, she cries out, ⁴ "Women

and men, people everywhere, I'm calling out to you! I cry out to all of humankind! ⁵ You who are simple, learn how to make sound judgments! To the foolish among you, use your common sense! ⁶ Listen closely, for what I say is worth hearing, and I will tell you what is right; ⁷ for my mouth will speak the truth and my lips hate to lie. ⁸ Everything I say is right;

none of it is twisted or crooked. ⁹ All of it is plain-spoken to those who understand,

clear to those seeking knowledge. ¹⁰ Accept my lessons in place of silver, and knowledge in place of gold; ¹¹ for wisdom outsparkles jewellery; anything you desire cannot compare to her. ¹² I, Wisdom, am the habitat of sound judgment,

the source of clear thinking. ¹³ To revere YHWH is to abhor evil. I despise pride and arrogance, corrupt behavior and deceptive words. ¹⁴ I have good counsel and sound judgment; I have understanding and power as well. ¹⁵ Rulers reign because of me, and administrators issue just judgments.

¹⁶ Because of me governors govern well, and the noble apply justice. ¹⁷ I love those who love me; and those who seek me out zealously find me. ¹⁸ Riches and honor are with me enduring wealth and prosperity.

¹⁹ The gifts I distribute are better than gold, even fine gold; and my profits are better than fire-tried silver. ²⁰ I walk the upright way, the path of justice, ²¹ bestowing wealth on those who love me, and filling their treasuries. ²² "YHWH gave birth to me at the beginning, before the first acts of creation. ²³ I have been from everlasting, in the beginning, before the world began. ²⁴ Before the deep seas, I was brought forth, before there were fountains or springs of water; ²⁵ before the mountains erupted up into place, before the hills, I was born— ²⁶ before God created the earth or its fields, or even the first clods of dirt. ²⁷ I was there when the Almighty created the heavens, and set the horizon just above the ocean, ²⁸ set the clouds in the sky, and established the springs of the deep, ²⁹ gave the seas their

boundaries and set their limits at the shoreline. When the foundation of the earth was laid out, ³⁰ I was the skilled artisan standing next to the Almighty. I was God's delight day after day, rejoicing at being in God's presence continually, ³¹ rejoicing in the whole world and delighting in humankind.

²⁵That's why I tell you not to worry about your livelihood, what you are to eat or drink or use for clothing. Isn't life more than just food? Isn't the body more than just clothes? 26 "Look at the birds in the sky. They don't sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet our God in heaven feeds them. Aren't you more important than they? 27 Which of you by worrying can add a moment to your lifespan? 28 And why be anxious about clothing? Learn a lesson from the way the wildflowers grow. They don't work; they don't spin. 29 Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in full splendor was arrayed like one of these. 30 If God can clothe in such splendor the grasses of the field, which bloom today and are thrown on the fire tomorrow, won't God do so much more for you—you who have so little faith? 31 "Stop worrying, then, over questions such as, 'What are we to eat,' or 'what are we to drink,' or 'what are we to wear?' 32 Those without faith are always running after these things. God knows everything you need. 33 Seek first God's reign, and God's justice, and all these things will be given to you besides. 34 Enough of worrying about tomorrow! Let tomorrow take care of itself. Today has troubles enough of its own.

Please Pray for the Next Stage of Shaped By God Together Bishop Martyn has written a letter to clergy to share across our diocese as we reach a significant moment in the life of the diocese with key decisions on how we are being 'Shaped By God Together', and asking our churches and communities to pray for the next stages of the process.

A key date for our prayers is 9th October when our Diocesan Synod meets to approve a new framework or structure for the diocese. Following that every person in our worshipping communities will be able to take part participate in making the new framework take shape in our own local contexts.

In his letter, Bishop Martyn stresses that the church will always need lay ministers, deacons, priests and bishops, just as we will always need and cherish parish churches which serve every person living in that parish. But how our ministers and parishes operate will start to look different in the coming years.

Update on Bishop Martyn's emergency appeal to support our partners in the Trichy Diocese



The response to Bishop Martyn's emergency appeal to support our partners in the Trichy Diocese in India as they work to care for those affected by Covid-19 has been tremendous. We have been able to send nearly £37,000 in total so far and this is being used to purchase vehicles and equipment to resource the diocese's hospitals and to support local churches throughout the diocese in caring for their communities. Bishop Chandrasekaran has written to express his sincere thanks to us for this generous support, adding: "We really had a difficult time - lost many lives including a few pastors. We earnestly seek your prayers and be sure of our prayers." The appeal will remain open for a little longer.
