# Advent Benefice Carol Service on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> November 6.30pm at St Marys

## **Rediscovering Advent, Reclaiming Christmas**

We often complain about the way in which Christmas has become commercialised and the true meaning of our celebration has been lost. One important way to counter this trend and to make sure that we ourselves are keeping the focus in the right place, is to **rediscover Advent** as an important season of the year, and in its own right.

Advent marks the beginning of the Christian year and can be seen as a time of preparation in a similar way to Lent. The colour used in church changes to purple, as a sign of this 'work of the heart', the inward and spiritual preparation that we take on so as to be ready once again, for the celebration of Christ's birth.

This year Advent Sunday falls on 28<sup>th</sup> November and the benefice choir will be leading us in a special Advent Service in St Mary's at 6.30pm. This is the best possible way to begin the journey towards Christmas, so do please join us.

This year there will also be four weekly **Advent Meditations** open to everyone - each Tuesday, 7.30pm at St Guthlac's (31<sup>st</sup> November, then 7<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> December). Each will be hosted by a member of our Ministry Team and will provide 45-60 minutes of prayers, reflections and music to help us keep hold of Advent as the pressures of the holiday season begin to take over.

Our **Advent Fellowship Group** will also meet on three Thursday mornings at the Vicarage, 5 Church Lane  $-2^{nd}$ ,  $9^{th}$  and  $16^{th}$  December from 10-11.30am. Each week we will be looking at some of the different names of Jesus from the Bible, and sharing stories, prayers and coffee & cake! Everyone is welcome but please sign up first by using the list at the back of the church or by leaving a message on the Vicarage answerphone (0116 270 4268).

There are also many books and resources online to help you take a few minutes for **daily reflection and prayer** through Advent. You might like to take a look, for example, at the Archbishop of York's Advent Book for 2021 – "Music of Eternity: Meditations for Advent with Evelyn Underhill" by Robyn Wrigley-Carr - which comes highly recommended. It's available from Christian Resources at St Martin's House in the city centre (0116 261 5222).

Tearfund are offering daily email devotions called 'Christmas in your global neighbourhood' at

Alternatively you might like to use a book that I have found particularly helpful: "Waiting here for you – an Advent journey of hope" by Louie Giglio. I have seven copies, each available for free or for a donation to Tearfund – just ask!

I hope you'll be able to rediscover Advent and so reclaim Christmas this year.

# New Bishop of Loughborough announced.

The Queen has approved the nomination of the Reverend Malayil Lukose Varghese Muthalaly (known as Saju), as the new Suffragan Bishop of Loughborough. He succeeds the first-ever Bishop of Loughborough, the Right Revd Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani who became Bishop of Chelmsford earlier this year.



Bishop-elect Saju said: "It is an honour and a joy to be invited to become the next Bishop of Loughborough and I am looking forward to getting to know the people of Leicestershire.


"My priorities in ministry are profoundly relational. If I have felt anointed in anything, it is in forming friendships, gathering

God's people, and creating hospitable and loving spaces in which people can grow in faith, hope, justice and love.

"I have a deep desire for the flourishing of all people, particularly the poor, those at the margins of our world. I grew up in a leprosy hospital in the city of Bangalore, India, where my mother worked as a nurse. From my earliest memory, my heart has bent towards those who live in poverty."

For the last seven years, Bishop-elect Saju has been the vicar of St Mark's and St Mary's Island, Gillingham, in the Diocese of Rochester, Kent. He will be moving, with his wife and four children, to the diocese in the spring.

Bishop of Leicester, the Rt Revd Martyn Snow said: "We are delighted that Saju is coming to join us in the Diocese of Leicester where we cherish the wide diversity of our worshipping communities and are looking to strengthen parishes and help them do more with their local schools. We look forward to the energy and enthusiasm Saju brings, knowing that he will be a Bishop who is first and foremost a disciple committed to listening and learning as he joins us in our vision of seeking the Kingdom of God."



#### **Eco-Tip of the week**



#### No textiles need go to landfill!

We all have clothes or textiles such as curtains, duvet covers and blankets that we don't want any more or are past their best.

But did you know that in the UK around 336,000 tonnes of our unwanted textiles get thrown away every year?

The good news is that there are simple ways to keep **all** textiles in use, and out of landfill.

I expect most of us already donate clothes and textiles that are in good condition to charity shops or put them in door-to-door collection bags. This is an important way to minimise the overall impact that clothing has on our environment.

However, did you know that items that aren't suitable to be passed onto someone else can be recycled and made into new items, such as padding for chairs and car seats, cleaning cloths and industrial blankets?

- M and S have a 'Shwopping' scheme whereby you can take unwanted textiles of any quality to one of their clothing stores and put it in a Shwop Box. Saleable items will be passed to Oxfam and the rest will go for recycling. Nothing is wasted!
- Textile recycling banks are widely available e.g. on the car park behind Boots in Oadby


