"Doing Lent Gently" in 2022



Often Lent is seen as a rather harsh and certainly penitential part of church year we are touah on ourselves as preparation for the joy of Easter. This spirit of selfexamination. even criticism, and abstinence

has its place and can prove valuable – *however* – given that so much has already been sacrificed over the last two years, perhaps this Lent should be less about discipline and more about gentleness, with ourselves and each other.

A gentle Lent might help us draw closer to the gentle self-giving of Jesus himself, on his journey to the cross and beyond.

Here are a few suggestions for 'doing Lent gently':


Being still – choose a time each day when you can be still and just sit for a few minutes, either in silence with a five-minute timer, or listening, eyes closed, to a favourite gentle song;

Letting go – think of something that takes time but makes little difference to anyone else, and just let go of it until Easter.... it could be the time you spend on Facebook, watching a TV soap, painting your nails or polishing the car. You could use the time for catching up on something long postponed.

Simple giving – identify a simple thing you can give to others once a week (or more, if easier) ... it could be writing a postcard each weekend to send on Monday, putting flowers in your window, or letting someone go ahead of you in the shopping queue.

Join 'Difference' – this Lent, over five Wednesday evenings from 9th March, we are running 'Difference', a course (on Zoom) that equips Christians to cross divides, navigate disagreement and pursue a just and flourishing world. Through film, Bible study, prayer and discussion we are encouraged to develop the three habits of being curious, being present and reimagining – to build reconciliation and change in place of division. Get reading - follow up our Sunday series on women of the



Bible by reading "Women of Holy Week" by Paula Gooder. This is an imaginative retelling, in nine stories, of the events of the last days of Jesus through the eyes of the women accompanying him. We'll also have a special coffee morning to discuss the stories together, at 10am on Wednesday 6th April at the Vicarage. The Collect & Readings for the Third Sunday in Lent

The Collect

Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain,

and entered not into glory before he was crucified: mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Amen.

First Reading: Isaiah 55.1-9

Psalm 63.1-8

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10.1-13

Gospel reading: Luke 13. 1-9

¹There were some present who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. ²He asked them, 'Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? ³No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. ⁴Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them - do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? ⁵No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did.'

⁶Then he told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. ⁷So he said to the gardener, "See here! For three years I have

come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?" ⁸He replied, "Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. ⁹If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."

As we survey the world's suffering, our faith may struggle. In this time of Lent, may be honestly see the world and our lives are not as God intended. May we strive to work afresh for peace in our own hearts, our relationships and our world. May we know the Lord more in our lives and that we are incomplete and in need of Christ.

We appeal to our loving Lord and Father for peace in Ukraine. We appeal for the Prince of Peace to reign in the hearts of those shaping the conflict and with the power to stop it. We pray for the Russian Orthodox Church. We call upon Patriarch Krill to speak truth and justice into the war and the drivers of war. We bring to mind the words of Pope Francis, 'wars are alway unjust. Because the one who pays is the people of God. Our hearts cannot help but cry in front of the children, the women killed, all the victims of war. War is never the way. The Spirit that unites us asks us as pastors to help the peoples who suffer from war'.

Lord give us the courage to open our churches, our homes and our lives to the anticipated flux of Ukrainian refugees. Help us overcome fears of scarcity and security. As we know that we worship a God of grace who pours out his grace daily on an undeserving people, may we share such grace with strangers,

remembering Jesus' words, 'that whatever you do for the least, you are doing for me'. Amen

War in Ukraine - how to help

We have all seen terrible scenes from the war in Ukraine on our televisions and naturally we feel moved to want to help those suffering.

Firstly, please make sure you are **praying** for the civilians caught in



the invasion and those who have had to become refugees. We have a prayer here or there is "A Prayer for Ukraine" later in this Newsletter:

Heavenly Father, hear our prayers for our brothers and sisters in Ukraine.

Lord, we ask for peace for those who need peace, reconciliation for those who need reconciliation and comfort for all who don't know what tomorrow will bring. Lord may your Kingdom come, and Your will be done.

Lord God, we ask for you to be with all – especially children - who are suffering as the crisis in Ukraine deteriorates. Lord for those who are anxious and fearful. For those who are bereaved, injured or who have lost their lives. And for those who have lost homes and loved ones. Lord hear our prayers.

Secondly, please consider **giving** to the relief appeal launched by the Disasters Emergency Committee.

Caring for each other at church during infectious times

As you'll know we are no longer subject to Government legal regulations and restrictions relating to Corona virus. Our Worship Committee met recently, on behalf of the PCC, to discuss what precautions we should discontinue or keep at St Guthlac's. We were agreed firstly, that when we come to church we should continue to have the highest regard for the safety and wellbeing of other people as well as our own comfort.

We have also agreed that we should gradually increase the number of chairs in the church, and that from Easter we will resume having refreshments after the service. The choir will once again be able to process to their places, we will place a collection plate at the back of the church and we will stop recording those present at each service. For the moment we do not feel it is the right time to resume offering the wine to the congregation as part of our Communion services. The priest officiating at Communion will continue to sanitise their hands and wear a mask as now.

Other matters are very much down to each person's own conscience, but can I please ask you, when you come to church:

- to consider continuing to wear your face covering;
- to consider sanitising your hands on the way into church;
- to avoid crowding together when finding a seat and after church to give people a little more space than usual;
- **not** to come to church if you have any symptoms of covid-19 or a positive lateral flow test in the last 24 hours;
- to be understanding of those people whose response to the hazards of the virus is different to your own.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation with these precautions and changes – this way we can remain both safe and welcoming! *Adrian*

The National Day of Reflection—Wednesday 23rd March

The 23rd March will be the second anniversary of the start of the first national lockdown in response to the Corona virus pandemic. Back in 2020 we had little idea about the way in which this new virus would reshape our daily lives in the days to come, would galvanise the world's scientists to discover and develop vaccines at unprecedented speed, and would challenge our health professionals to the extreme. Few of us would have suspected the scale of loss and pain, through bereavement, illness, separation and isolation that we would face as a country, but also as families and individuals.

While life now is beginning to return to 'normal' many of us still need the opportunity to reflect, grieve and pray in the face of all that we have experienced. Doing this together will help us to find healing and hope for the future.

On 23rd March, St Mary's will be open during the day from 11am to 1pm for all of us, if we would like this opportunity. At noon we will mark the national silence and have a few prayers. There will also be the chance to leave your own written prayers, to light a candle in memory of a loved one and to place a daffodil as a sign of hope. Clergy and volunteers will be on hand to talk and help.
