The Collect & Readings for the Sixth Sunday of Easter

The Collect

God our redeemer, you have delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of your Son: grant, that as by his death he has recalled us to life, so by his continual presence in us he may raise us to eternal joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. Amen.

First Reading: Acts 16.9-15

During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." After Paul had seen the vision, we got ready at once to leave for Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them.

From Troas we put out to sea and sailed straight for Samothrace, and the next day on to Neapolis. From there we travelled to Philippi, a Roman colony and the leading city of that district of Macedonia. And we stayed there several days.

On the Sabbath we went outside the city gate to the river, where we expected to find a place of prayer. We sat down and began to speak to the women who had gathered there. One of those listening was a woman named Lydia, a dealer in purple

cloth from the city of Thyatira, who was a worshipper of God. The Lord opened her heart to respond to Paul's message. When she and the members of her household were baptised, she invited us to her home. "If you consider me a believer in the Lord," she said, "come and stay at my house." And she persuaded us.

Gospel reading: John 5.1-9

¹After this there was a festival of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

²Now in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate there is a pool, called in Hebrew Beth-zatha, which has five porticoes. ³In these lay many invalids - blind, lame, and paralysed. ⁵One man was there who had been ill for thirty-eight years. ⁶When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been there a long time, he said to him, 'Do you want to be made well?' ⁷The sick man answered him, 'Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; and while I am making my way, someone else steps down ahead of me.' ⁸Jesus said to him, 'Stand up, take your mat and walk.' ⁹At once the man was made well, and he took up his mat and began to walk.



Ukrainian Refugee Host Sponsorship

You may already be aware that the government is encouraging householders and communities to act as hosts to offer temporary accommodation or support for the 1000s of Ukrainian refugees expecting to arrive in the UK to escape the warzone.

Leicester Diocese and Leicester University are official community sponsors and the council is responsible for safeguarding and vetting.

Hosting is not just about accommodation, rather it is being prepared to be a place of welcome and support. Government will financially support the families and they will be entitled to work and access benefits and services.

The Diocese is currently gathering data on churches, individuals and householders who are signing up either to the government accommodation scheme and need to be under the sponsorship of the Diocese, or families and churches willing to offer support. I am currently collating this for our parishes.

Caring for each other at church during infectious times

As you'll know we are no longer subject to Government legal regulations and restrictions relating to Corona virus. Our Worship Committee met, on behalf of the PCC, to discuss what precautions we should discontinue or keep at St Guthlac's. We were agreed firstly, that when we come to church we should continue to have the highest regard for the safety and wellbeing of other people as well as our own comfort.

There have already been some changes. All the chairs are back in the church and the Welcome Area is fully accessible, so that refreshments will be available after the services. We no longer record those present at each service. However, a collection plate will not be passed around during the service but will be placed at the back of the church.

For the moment we do *not* feel it is the right time to resume offering the wine to the congregation as part of our Communion services. The priest officiating at Communion will continue to sanitise their hands and wear a mask.

Other matters are very much down to each person's own conscience, but can we please ask you, when you come to church:

- to consider continuing to wear your face covering;
- to consider sanitising your hands on the way into church;
- to avoid crowding together when finding a seat and after church to give people a little more space than usual;
- not to come to church if you have any symptoms of covid-19 or a positive lateral flow test in the last 24 hours;
- to be understanding of those people whose response to the hazards of the virus is different to your own.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation with these precautions and changes – this way we can remain both safe and welcoming! *Adrian & Churchwardens*

Request from the Vicar: Can you help to give Cecilia and her family a summer holiday?

Friends,

I hope you'll forgive me emailing from the seclusion of my sabbatical study leave, but I have an important request -I want to ask if you'll consider making a contribution to the cost of a holiday for Cecilia Adjadje (our Vicar-in-training who is with us for two years) and her family this year.

Cecilia, Peter and their children arrived in the UK from Nigeria five years ago, so that Cecilia could study for an MBA. When Cecilia felt called to ordination she was supported by our Diocese and, after the usual lengthy and detailed discernment process, she was subsequently selected for training. She is now approaching the half-way point of a two year course with the College of St Mellitus, and is attached to us in Knighton as the context for all the practical elements of her training before ordination. If you know them already, then I'm sure you share with me the sense that the whole family is a blessing to us, that Cecilia is growing in her confidence and skills, and that God will use her ministry as a support of encouragement and hope to many people in the future.

However, Cecilia, Peter and the children have not had a holiday since their arrival in the UK.

As a disabled wheelchair user without a car, Cecilia faces significant barriers to which most of us never have to give a second thought. In addition, as they are still classed as 'temporary' residents, the family have very limited recourse to benefits and public funds, and Peter is not able to work as a

teacher. Like all ordinands in training, Cecilia receives a basic grant from the Diocese for living costs, but it doesn't cover anything beyond that - hence there is no possibility of a holiday unless it can be funded in other ways.

This is where I hope that we as a church family can make a significant difference.

A grant has helped us book a holiday for the whole Adjadje family this summer at Scargill House in the Yorkshire Dales, at the same time as our own family and others from St Mary's as we attend the Summerfest Holiday Week. The Scargill Community provide a wonderful warm Christian welcome, and a whole programme of talks, activities and entertainment for the inside of a week - a lovely chance for Cecilia, Peter, Esther, David and Daniel to relax and recharge. The remaining issue is the cost of transport to Wharfdale and back.

Having investigated all the possibilities, the only realistic transport option is the hire of a wheelchair- accessible minivan, so the whole family can travel together and have the option of moving around while on holiday too. We can provide a driver, but the cost of hire for the week is almost £700, plus the petrol of course.

My email is to ask you if you can help by making a contribution, of any size, to these costs, and so help Cecilia and family to take this holiday? Many of us feel under financial strain at the moment so this may not feel possible for you, but any thing you can give will be much appreciated.

If you'd like to support them in this way, then please make a direct bank payment to the St Mary's Church account (with the

Eco-Tip of the month: May



Low waste bathroom swaps

The average bathroom is awash with plastic: Bottles of shampoo, conditioner, bubble bath, shower gel, hand wash....... as well as toothbrushes, tubes of toothpaste, razors, synthetic sponges, wet wipes, make up removal pads and more. Taking steps to reduce bathroom plastic may seem daunting, but there are some easy swaps you can make.







Shampoo, conditioner, shower gel and soap

- Try solid, plastic free shampoo and conditioner bars, or buy liquid brands which can be refilled locally
- Use a bar of soap instead of shower gels and liquid soaps: many types are available either unpackaged or in plastic free packaging

Dental care

It is estimated that 150 million plastic toothbrushes go to landfill in the UK annually, along with plastic toothpaste tubes and mouth wash bottles.

- Swap to bamboo toothbrushes
- Choose mouthwash in glass bottles, or try mouthwash tablets
- Toothpaste is now available in glass jars or metal tubes

Wet wipes and make up removal pads

These have become the scourge of sewers, with a 700% increase in use over the last decade (amounting to 11 billion a year in the UK) contributing to the formation of fatbergs and pollution of beaches and oceans

- Swap to reusable fabric wipes and makeup pads made of natural materials, which are widely available to buy
- Recycle old towels, flannels and muslins to make wipes and cloths
