The Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, you are always more ready to hear than we to pray and to give more than either we desire or deserve: pour down upon us the abundance of your mercy, forgiving us those things of which our conscience is afraid and giving us those good things which we are not worthy to ask but through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading: Jeremiah 18.1-11

Psalm 139.1-5, 12-18

Second Reading: Philemon 1-21

Readings for this Sunday's Creationtide theme: What does being Jesus' disciple mean for us as Christians and how might that affect how we care for and celebrate creation?

Psalm 98 Praise the Judge of the World

O sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvellous things. His right hand and his holy arm have gained him victory. ²The LORD has made known his victory; he has revealed his vindication in the sight of the nations.

³ He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel.

²⁵Large crowds were travelling with Jesus; and he turned and said to them, ²⁶'Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. ²⁷Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, ³⁰saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." ³¹Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³²If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a

delegation and asks for the terms of peace. ³³So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.'

National survivor survey launched to inform the CofE's safeguarding work

A national survey of survivors and victims of abuse has been launched by the Church of England to listen to their views on the development and implementation of its safeguarding structure. It is an opportunity to be involved in the development and implementation of a Church of England survivor engagement framework, which will set out how victims and survivors of abuse will inform the Church's work to develop and improve safeguarding.

The anonymous survey is available on the survivor engagement webpage of the Church of England's website and runs for two months from 19 July until 18 September 2022. Find out more here.

A midweek online haven The experience of Compline March 2020 – August 2022

The Compline service is at 8.00pm on a Wednesday. It presents the traditional service through modern technology, via Zoom, using a telephone or computer in an accessible democratic way. Everyone can take part in the service as the parts of the service are shared out. It has been easy to use.

About 14 to 20 people take part each Wednesday. At the last meeting the participants reviewed the past 2½ years of Compline. They felt that the Compline online service has shown that good can come out of bad (Covid) by providing a 'real service' for those who can't easily access a service because they are protecting their health; are cautious about going out in the evening; or because they want a midweek service.

Before the service starts, there is a chance to chat informally and to discuss a topic for 10 minutes in very small groups. Participants felt that it has brought members of St Mary's and St Guthlac's churches closer together in a relaxing supporting atmosphere where they can have liturgical prayer as well as laughs. They have enjoyed meeting new people from the churches.

Cecilia's studies whilst with us in Knighton: Cecilia, our ordinand in training, has now started her second and final year at St Mellitus College. During the course of this year there are three modules of study that require her to reflect specifically on what she is learning and experiencing with us at St Guthlac's and St Mary's:

- Evangelism in Practice: ordinands are expected to reflect upon their experience of evangelism in their context over a period of approximately 6 weeks;
- Foundations in Christian Worship: ordinands are expected to reflect upon their experience of worship in the placement;
- **Preaching:** ordinands are expected to record and reflect upon preaching experience.

Cecilia and I are also asked to think through and discuss how she is demonstrating and growing in a list of six specific personal qualities:

- Love for God
- Call to Ministry
- Love for People
- Wisdom
- Fruitfulness
- Trustworthiness

The last quality, in particular, is used to assess the commitment in terms of safeguarding, professional conduct and living within the boundaries and values of the Church.

These conversations inform the written comments that I then submit to the College and which help to shape the report to the Bishop at the end of the year.

I know that Cecilia is very happy to talk about her studies and college life so do please ask her some questions if you'd like to know more. Adrian

Ride and Stride 2022 at St Guthlac's: 10th September 10:00 - 18:00. The annual Ride and Stride event will take place on 10th September from 10:00 to 18:00. This is a fundraising event for the Leicestershire Historic Churches Trust (LHCT) which supports churches in Leicestershire with grants for improvement and maintenance costs. Half of all funds raised by participants can go to their local church so everyone benefits. The LHCT publish a list of all churches and chapels that are open on the day and then participants can plot their walking or cycling route between any number of the churches. St Guthlac's is taking part and would like to open to welcome visiting walkers and cyclists to the church.

I'd like to encourage you to get involved in any of the following ways.

- (1) By volunteering to for a slot to welcome visitors to the church. If you're interested there will be a rota at the back of church so please do sign up for an hour (or more). It can be a restful way to spend some time and as a "Rider" or "Strider" it is always a real joy to find the church open and people present to welcome you.
- (2) By cycling or walking between open churches. This gives you a chance to see inside some of the beautiful churches of our city and county.

All participants, whether welcomers or riders and striders, can be sponsored. If you'd like to participate please speak to Fiona for lists of churches and sponsorship forms. If you'd like to ride and stride but are a little unsure of the format or would prefer not to go on your own then join Fiona from 10:15 for a cycle tour around some of the churches in Knighton, Stoneygate and City Centre who will be taking part which should take about 4 hours allowing time for stops.

Caring for each other at church during infectious times

As you'll know we are no longer subject to Government legal regulations and restrictions relating to Corona virus. Our Worship Committee met, on behalf of the PCC, to discuss what precautions we should discontinue or keep at St Guthlac's. We were agreed firstly, that when we come to church we should continue to have the highest regard for the safety and wellbeing of other people as well as our own comfort.

For the moment we do *not* feel it is the right time to resume offering the wine to the congregation as part of our Communion services. The priest officiating at Communion will continue to sanitise their hands and wear a mask.

Other matters are very much down to each person's own conscience, but can we please ask you, when you come to church:

- to consider continuing to wear your face covering;
- to consider sanitising your hands on the way into church;
- to avoid crowding together when finding a seat and after church to give people a little more space than usual;
- not to come to church if you have any symptoms of covid-19 or a positive lateral flow test in the last 24 hours:
- to be understanding of those people whose response to the hazards of the virus is different to your own.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation with these precautions and changes - this way we can remain both safe and welcoming! Adrian & Churchwardens
