Bishop Christopher Boyle On Sunday 18th September we were delighted to have Bishop Christopher Boyle preside at our Eucharist

In Malawi medical facilities are scarce bishop's mobile the and clinic provides help to people who would otherwise have access modern no to medicine. St Guthlac's is proud to have been an active

supporter of this work for many years. Bishop Christopher explained that the medical team had expanded and now provides a wider range of services. They had also received an ambulance (picture) from the Archbishop of Canterbury which made travelling to the remote villages with all their equipment easier. St Guthlac's presented Bishop Christopher with a cheque for £1000, which he said would fund another two visits. He explained the impact St Guthlac's continued support is having in an area where malnutrition was on the rise again. In his words "What you have done will change lives and save lives of those I describe as living right at the end of the road".
