Caring for each other at church during infectious times-UPDATE

Our Worship Committee, on behalf of the PCC, continue to discuss the precautions we should take at St Guthlac's. We would urge everyone to continue thinking about the best ways to ensure that illnesses are not spread at church, for instance staying at home if you feel unwell. Please also continue to be understanding of those people whose response to the hazards of the virus is different to your own.

Following a successful trial at our midweek Communions, we will now be offering the wine as well as the bread to everyone at Sunday morning Eucharists - if you would like to take it. "Simultaneous Communion" means that the priest will take each wafer one at a time and dip the edge into the chalice of wine, before placing it in the Communicants hands as usual. This allows for the sharing of wine from a Common Cup, but without the hazards of each person actually using the Cup themselves.

The priests officiating at Communion will sanitise their hands before taking the bread and wine to the congregation. They will not wear a mask as they now mix normally at all other times.

The Wardens and I would be very pleased to have your feedback on this way of receiving, so do please let us know what you think when you've tried it out a few times.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation with these changes and precautions – this way we can remain both safe and welcoming!

Update on Malawi from Bishop Christopher

Recently, I had a message from Malawi that they have had an outbreak of cholera. I have been exchanging messages with our medical team and the diocese. I've been impressed with what has been happening. The Diocese has built three boreholes in and around the infected areas; the third will be completed soon. Access to clean safe water is essential if cholera is to be eradicated

Our Team Medical Leader, Dr John Chipolombwe, has been talking with the District Health Officers for Chamalala (Kasungu) and Mfula (North and South Mzimba). He tells me that help from the UN has given funds for vaccinations, chlorine (means to purify water) all of which I had mentioned to him. So this is excellent news. More importantly, and the most significant intervention, is to have access to clean safe water - as I've said - but also the building of latrines to stop the frequent and dangerous practice of open defecation. Currently, what they lack to move this programme on - the education on how to prevent cholera - is funds for the sensitisation campaign and chlorination of water points

In consultation with the local health districts Dr Chiplombwe has sent me a budget to help launch this programme: £800. It sounds a large sum of money. I think this is about 50% of what might be required but it is all he has asked for. The programme will involve almost 100 personnel. It consists of a mixture of invited guests (e.g Village Headman, Headteachers and others); it is a way of getting the villagers there. Also performers. Drama is a big part of getting the message across as well as support staff all who need feeding and allowances. Included in this is the cost for a meeting tent and amplification hire.

I'm confident we can raise this and I'm very keen to do so. The impact will be significant for 1,000s of people and a swathe of the Northern Region of Malawi. Later today or as soon as I can I'll send some other emails and make some 'phone calls. I have some funds in reserve which we could use.

Communitrees
