

Blessing your donations & the Collection Plate

Lent 2023

Lent is the traditional part of the Christian year that covers the weeks before Easter, and acts as a preparation for the sombre reflection of Good Friday and the joyful celebration of Easter Day.

This year the start of Lent, **Ash Wednesday**, is 22nd February, and as usual, everyone is encouraged to come to our special benefice Communion service at 7.30pm, at St Guthlac's Church. The choir will lead us in a reflective service with traditional hymns, and we will offer 'ashing' if you wish - the marking of a small cross in ashes on your forehead, symbolising repentance and a turning back towards God.

Lent is also a time for growing in faith through spiritual 'disciplines' – perhaps you will give up some luxury and keep the money for charity, or take up a special practice for these six weeks, such as a weekly donation to the foodbank or reading a Christian book.

There are two opportunities for you to join other members of our churches in a weekly discussion group during Lent as well. We shall be using a booklet called "Exploring God's Mercy: five images of salvation", written by the Bishop of Oxford, the Rt Revd Steven Croft. You can join a group on Wednesday mornings, at 10.30am in the small Cottage Room in the St Mary's Parish Centre, OR at 2.30pm on Thursday afternoons, at the home of Janet Edwards. Please sign up on the list at the back of the church so that we have an idea of numbers coming. I'll be in touch with everyone to make sure that you know where to go! Our group meetings begin on Wednesday 1st March and Thursday 2nd March.

Let's pray that Lent will be a time that God speaks to us all, and that, as he helps us understand our weaknesses afresh, we might also find more loving understanding of each other.

Ash Wednesday Benefice Communion Service St Guthlac's Church Wednesday 22nd February at 7.30pm All welcome The Church of England and Same-Sex Relationships: Recently we saw the General Synod of the Church of England (the representative and governing body) debating the Bishops' proposals for the blessing of same-sex relationships by ordained clergy, in church. You may well have seen reporting in the media on the rather heated exchanges and the deep divisions that exist between Christians on this issue.

Some of us can watch the arguments in a slightly detached way, as other people getting worked up about something that seems clear to us, or is not that significant. Others of us, though, may feel bewilderment and confusion in the face of complex arguments about reason, tradition, compassion, inclusion and Biblical faithfulness. Others, again, may feel deep pain and hurt, because the debate actually touches on real life experience - our own, our friend's, or perhaps that of someone in the family - and what for some is doctrinal or theoretical is, for us, personal and every-day. Any one of us might benefit from a quiet, considered conversation about the issues and, perhaps, our own experience and concerns.

If such a confidential conversation would help you, then do please let me know - over the next few weeks I'll be keeping time aside specifically for this. Alternatively, you might prefer to talk to my wife, Revd Alison Roche, who also has previous direct experience talking through these matters.

On our part, there's no agenda, apart from the questions or experiences that you might like to talk over, and the support that either of us might be able to give you in confidence. Christian growth means moving from a 'Sunday Faith', limited to church on just one day, to 'Everyday Faith', allowing God to shape our whole lives and all our relationships.

Prayer and reading the Bible have always been key parts of Everyday Faith. Our ancestors, who had limited access to the printed word and perhaps struggled with reading more than we do, were used to memorising Bible passages that would later help them in times of trouble and challenge – a skill that we have mostly lost.

We can, however, get to know key Bible passages so well that their familiar words will return to us when most needed.

At the back of church this Sunday there is a small booklet in which we've printed out a selection of important Bible passages that all Christians should feel familiar with. Please do take one home with you and give one to your friends. This Lent you might like to take up the habit of reading your booklet each day, and letting these wonderful words soak in.

Caring for each other at church during infectious times

Our Worship Committee, on behalf of the PCC, continue to discuss the precautions we should take at St Guthlac's. We would urge everyone to continue thinking about the best ways to ensure that illnesses are not spread at church, for instance staying at home if you feel unwell. Please also continue to be understanding of those people whose response to the hazards of the virus is different to your own.

Following a successful trial at our midweek Communions, we will now be offering the wine as well as the bread to everyone at Sunday morning Eucharists - if you would like to take it. "Simultaneous Communion" means that the priest will take each wafer one at a time and dip the edge into the chalice of wine, before placing it in the Communicants hands as usual. This allows for the sharing of wine from a Common Cup, but without the hazards of each person actually using the Cup themselves.

The priests officiating at Communion will sanitise their hands before taking the bread and wine to the congregation. They will not wear a mask as they now mix normally at all other times.

The Wardens and I would be very pleased to have your feedback on this way of receiving, so do please let us know what you think when you've tried it out a few times.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation with these changes and precautions – this way we can remain both safe and welcoming!

We would now like to twin the toilets in Holbrook Hall with other latrines in Malawi.

There is a collection jar at the entrance to the church where donations, large or small can be made.

Please look at the framed certificate on the windowsill next time you use the church facilities. By twinning our toilets, we are recognising our good fortune in having excellent sanitation, and showing that we care about others living in very different circumstances. By donating £60 to twin your toilet, you help fund a project in a community that will enable families to build a basic toilet, have access to clean water and learn about hygiene – a vital combination that saves lives. Both cost £60, which I think you will agree would be money well spent!

Water Aid Your donations in the Water Aid jar have raised £65.15, which will be forwarded to the charity. Many thanks. As you will see from the article above, the PCC have decided that for the time being, future donations will be used to fund latrines in Malawi.
