Lent 2023

Lent is the traditional part of the Christian year that covers the weeks before Easter, and acts as a preparation for the sombre reflection of Good Friday and the joyful celebration of Easter Day.

Lent can be a time for growing in faith and so we have two weekly opportunities for you to join other members of our churches in a discussion group using a booklet called "Exploring God's Mercy: five images of salvation", written by the Bishop of Oxford, the Rt Revd Steven Croft.

You can join a group on Wednesday mornings, at 10.30am in the small Cottage Room in the St Mary's Parish Centre, OR at 2.30pm on Thursday afternoons, at the home of Janet Edwards. Let's pray that Lent will be a time that God speaks to us all, and that, as he helps us understand our weaknesses afresh, we might also find more loving understanding of each other.

Everyday Faith - 'Give us this day our daily bread'

Christian growth means moving from a 'Sunday Faith', limited to church on just one day, to 'Everyday Faith', allowing God to shape our whole lives and all our relationships.

Generations of Christians have found that they need the regular teaching and support of the Bible to keep them growing in faith and on-track with their Christian life — 'daily bread' whatever the circumstances.

One way in which we can easily do this is to use **Bible reading notes.** Each booklet typically covers a few months at a time and has a page for each day, including a short Bible passage to read, a thought to help us understand and apply the passage, and a prayer. This approach gives some simple structure and helps us establish a daily pattern, even though it may only take a few minutes. I'd certainly recommend it, from my own experience.

At the back of church this Sunday there is a collection of different types of Bible reading notes – each has their own style and a slightly different approach. Can I encourage you to have a look, and, if you haven't tried them before, to take a sample home and give it a go? They're all free, and you don't need to bring it back.

If you would like to continue with these notes past Easter, then do let me know, and I can help – some are free and easily obtainable, whilst others have a modest price and may need to be ordered – large print is often available too.

Lent is an ideal time to try something new like this, and I'm sure that you'll find daily Bible notes a real help as you grow in Everyday Faith. *Adrian*

Deanery Synod Representative for St Guthlac's: Every three years St Guthlac's (and all churches in the City Deanery) get to select two representatives for the Deanery Synod. meets three times a year at various churches within the deanery. Deanery Synod plays an important role in the life of the church by enabling reps from different churches to meet and share their experience and knowledge with one another. It helps foster understanding of the very different challenges that the churches face. The City Deanery is a very diverse deanery in terms of traditions. financial situation and contexts. It also provides a way for the laity to inform and influence initiatives that come forward from the diocese and national church. Its role in the future is likely to be important as the diocese looks to understand and expand the implementation of minster communities, even though they may not be bounded by existing deanery boundaries.

I have had the pleasure and privilege to represent St Guthlac's at the Deanery Synod for the last 16 years but have decided not to put my name forward for nomination this year for personal reasons. St Guthlac's is therefore looking for at least one person to present the church at the synod. If you think this might be something you would like to do and would like more information please get in touch. I would encourage everyone to consider this opportunity - it will surprise you. *Fiona Wingate*

Deanery Synod meeting being held on <u>Monday 27th March</u>, <u>7.30pm</u> in St. Andrew's Church, Aylestone.

This is an important meeting, **OPEN to ALL** regarding the finance of the diocese and how it may affect your church. Please attend if at all possible - synod representatives/members, PCC members, Churchwardens and Treasurers included. Please spread the word! Representatives from the Diocesan Board of Finance will be sharing some hard truths about our financial situation and how we can all contribute to the long term funding of local ministry to endeavour to solve the funding gap between parish contributions and clergy costs in the Diocese. **Refreshments will be served from 7pm.**

Caring for each other at church during infectious times

Our Worship Committee, on behalf of the PCC, continue to discuss the precautions we should take at St Guthlac's. We would urge everyone to continue thinking about the best ways to ensure that illnesses are not spread at church, for instance staying at home if you feel unwell. Please also continue to be understanding of those people whose response to the hazards of the virus is different to your own.

Following a successful trial at our midweek Communions, we will now be offering the wine as well as the bread to everyone at Sunday morning Eucharists - if you would like to take it. "Simultaneous Communion" means that the priest will take each wafer one at a time and dip the edge into the chalice of wine, before placing it in the Communicants hands as usual. This allows for the sharing of wine from a Common Cup, but without the hazards of each person actually using the Cup themselves.

The priests officiating at Communion will sanitise their hands before taking the bread and wine to the congregation. They will not wear a mask as they now mix normally at all other times.

The Wardens and I would be very pleased to have your feedback on this way of receiving, so do please let us know what you think when you've tried it out a few times.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation with these changes and precautions – this way we can remain both safe and welcoming!

Mothering Sunday 2023

Mothering Sunday has come a long way from its origins, when people used to return to the 'mother church' where they were baptised, but it remains an important time to foster closeness and relationships - we share flowers and gifts with loved ones and remember all those who have shown us mothering care. So, once again, in Church, on 19th March, we will have a special service, reflect on God's love shown to us, and express our thanks and appreciation for mothers.

All of this is good but there is another perspective too. Today we are very much more aware of the great variety of mother-child relationships in our society, and that our experiences are not always positive. Remembering Mum's who have died, whether recently or some years ago, is also sad and poignant on this day. Mothering Sunday can be a painful day for many people.

We also know that it is not only birth mothers, and indeed not only women, who can demonstrate the loving care that we think of as "mothering", towards others. Mothering Sunday, therefore, is becoming much more than a traditional celebration – rather, it is a day to remember and celebrate the loving relationships between



generations, alongside reflection on the pain and distance that can also be a feature of these relationships - and a day to seek God's healing for our fractured society.

Having said all of that, there will still be much in

our service that we will all recognise, and a real sense of gratitude to all mothers and carers. In 2023, Mothering Sunday, 19th March, falls on the third Sunday of the month, so we'll be celebrating within the context of our regular Communion service - do please invite friends, relatives and neighbours! There are some simple fliers at the back of church that you may find useful to give away. Thank you! *Adrian*
