EcoTip for July: Lending a helping hand in hot weather. Help hedgehogs in hot weather. Hedgehogs particularly need help in a heatwave, as their usual prey of slugs, snails and worms are often unavailable. Leaving out a juicy snack, such as mealworms or canned dog food, can help in sustained warm weather. If you have a garden pond, ensure there's always a way for hedgehogs (and other small mammals) to climb out if they fall in.

Dear Friends,

‘A BRIGHTER BUILDING’ - a new appeal.

Will you help fund the repair and re-decoration of St Guthlac’s?

Over the last year we have all had to bear the consequences of the “cost-of-living-crisis” - everyone’s budget has been squeezed, and some very tightly indeed.

Firstly therefore, I want to pass on the grateful thanks of the St Guthlac’s Church Council and myself, for your continuing financial support through your giving to the Church. Your donations and fundraising are essential – they enable the Church to maintain and expand our Christian life together, and to keep our focus on outreach and support in the local community and beyond.

Given the challenging times in which we live, it is more important than ever that everyone can find a welcoming space where we can worship God together and grow in the faith that gives us hope and security – and for many of us, that place is the local church.

This is why I am writing to you now. We want to ensure that St Guthlac’s is once again ‘A Brighter Building’ for meeting together and worship - and so today we are launching a new appeal for the funds needed for essential repairs and re-decoration.

The interior of the church was last painted many years ago, and after the installation of the new heating system the intention was always to completely redecorate and make good. Now that some considerable time has gone by, we are also concerned that the building will

deteriorate if we don't act soon; we know that spending money now will save higher costs in the future and want to nip any problems in the bud. The other building issue is that two areas of flooring have become weak and potentially unsafe – you may have seen the 'hazard' tape in the chancel area but there is also an area in the vestry that needs attention. Both areas will need to be taken up before repair, and more, unforeseen, problems may then become apparent.

We are now launching our '**A Brighter Building**' Appeal for **£20,000**, so that we can carry out these essential works.

Raising this amount will certainly be a challenge for us, but I am confident that

"God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4.19)

The Bible reminds us many times about God's incredible generosity towards us, and exhorts us all to reflect that generosity in our own giving:

"Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.... for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9.6 & 7)

So, can I urge you to consider how *you* can contribute to our appeal to create '**A Brighter Building**'? Our Appeal Donation Pack gives you all the information you need to make either a one-off gift or a regular contribution.

Thank you for supporting St Guthlac's, and enabling us, together, to provide a **Brighter Building** for the future of our special church.

A BRIGHTER BUILDING - DONATION INFORMATION

There are several alternative methods to give money to complete our fund-raising and allow the internal decoration to commence. You may choose the method that is most appealing to you. What is important with whichever method you choose is that you “Gift Aid” your donation if you are a tax payer, if you do that we can recover 25% of your donation from His Majesty’s Revenue and Customs at no cost to you. See the note below on Gift Aid for further details.

1. DONATION

We welcome any donation at any time for any amount. The donation can be put in one of our blue envelopes that can be found at the back of Church or one of your own envelopes; or alternatively, you may send or give the donation to me. If the donation is in an envelope, please make it clear by writing on the envelope that it is for the “Decorating Fund”. If you wish to keep your donation anonymous, just tell David, then only you and he will know. If you wish David to claim Gift Aid on your donation, see details in Section 7 below.

2. STANDING ORDER

A regular donation can be made to the Decorating Fund by means of a Standing Order. But you can choose the best method for doing this.

- If you don’t have a Standing Order set up, complete the Standing Order Request form to instruct your bank to set up your donation.
- If you already have a Standing Order set up with your bank, you can complete the Standing Order Request form to instruct your bank to increase your donation.

In each case, both halves of the standing order request form should be completed; send the top half to your bank and give the lower half to me.

In addition, please make sure you also complete the relevant section in Appendix A and return it to David. If you wish David to claim Gift Aid on your donation, see details in Section 7 below.

3. I WANT TO DONATE BY BANK TRANSFER

This can be done using our bank details; Sort Code: 20-49-08, Account Number: 53861341, Account Name: St Guthlacs PCC, Reference: Decorating. If you wish David to claim Gift Aid on your donation, see details in Section 7 below.

4. I WANT TO DONATE BY CREDIT/DEBIT CARD

This can be done from our website <https://www.stguthlac-knighton.co.uk>. In the grey area on the left hand side of the home page you will see “A Brighter Building”, click on the link for instructions. Alternatively, you can use your mobile phone and scan the QR code at the end of this document.

5. PLEDGE

This method does not involve any payment until we know we have enough money to start decorating. You can pledge any amount and once we know we have enough money and pledged money we will ask you for the money you have pledged within 4 weeks.

Please complete the enclosed pledge form and return it to David.

6. I WANT TO DONATE SOMETHING BUT THIS IS TOO COMPLICATED

If you find forms and choices too much but really want to help us begin decorating, or if you have any questions about donating, talk to David after a service, or email: treasurer@stguthlac-knighton.co.uk;

or alternatively, invite him for a cup of tea and a chat; all conversations will be strictly confidential and there will be no pressure on you to do anything you don't want to do. David will help you through the paperwork and leave you to decide if this is what you want to do.

7. GIFT AID

If you are a UK Tax Payer, "Gift Aiding" any donation you make to the Church is extremely valuable to us. We can claim from HMRC 25% of everything you donate and if everyone who is a tax payer does this, the benefits to us soon mount up; and it costs you nothing more than the donation you give to us. There is a fundamental rule that applies to the amount of Gift Aid we can claim. Charities can only claim Gift Aid up to the amount of income or capital gains tax you pay in a financial year. What does this mean? You need to consider all donations you make to any charity that you have agreed can be Gift Aided; as long as 25% of ALL those donations does not exceed the amount of income or capital gains tax you have paid in that financial year, all is well. If it is likely to exceed it, you could split the amount of donation with your spouse, or divide the donations over two financial years. If you have any doubts or concerns, talk to David. The important thing to remember is that he needs your address and signature indicating you wish to Gift Aid your donation and the easiest way to do that is to complete the Gift Aid Declaration form.

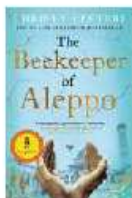
We are very grateful for all the donations we get from our congregation and friends, everyone is very supportive. Hopefully we will soon be able to begin to decorate the interior of our church and create

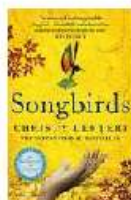
