Provide food and shelter for wildlife, now and in preparation for next year. Clean all your bird feeders to avoid the spread of disease to winter migrants and put up a nest box well in advance of breeding season. A nest box could also prove a cosy spot for small birds to spend the night on particularly cold winter evenings ahead.

Dear Friends,

'A BRIGHTER BUILDING' - a new appeal. Will you help fund the repair and re-decoration of St Guthlac's?

Over the last year we have all had to bear the consequences of the "cost-of-living-crisis" - everyone's budget has been squeezed, and some very tightly indeed.

Firstly therefore, I want to pass on the grateful thanks of the St Guthlac's Church Council and myself, for your continuing financial support through your giving to the Church. Your donations and fundraising are essential – they enable the Church to maintain and expand our Christian life together, and to keep our focus on outreach and support in the local community and beyond.

Given the challenging times in which we live, it is more important than ever that everyone can find a welcoming space where we can worship God together and grow in the faith that gives us hope and security – and for many of us, that place is the local church.

This is why I am writing to you now. We want to ensure that St Guthlac's is once again 'A Brighter Building' for meeting together and worship - and so today we are launching a new appeal for the funds needed for essential repairs and re-decoration.

The interior of the church was last painted many years ago, and after the installation of the new heating system the intention was always to completely redecorate and make good. Now that some considerable time has gone by, we are also concerned that the building will deteriorate if we don't act soon; we know that spending money now will save higher costs in the future and want to nip any problems in the bud. The other building issue is that two areas of flooring have become weak and potentially unsafe – you may have seen the 'hazard' tape in the chancel area but there is also an area in the vestry that needs attention. Both areas will need to be taken up before repair, and more, unforeseen, problems may then become apparent.

We are now launching our 'A Brighter Building' Appeal for £20,000, so that we can carry out these essential works.

Raising this amount will certainly be a challenge for us, but I am confident that

"God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4.19)

The Bible reminds us many times about God's incredible generosity towards us, and exhorts us all to reflect that generosity in our own giving:

"Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.... for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9.6 & 7)

So, can I urge you to consider how *you* can contribute to our appeal to create 'A Brighter Building'? Our Appeal Donation Pack gives you all the information you need to make either a one-off gift or a regular contribution.

The violence in Israel and Gaza this week -

Watching the terrible scenes of violence from Israel and Gaza this week, you may have wondered with great sadness how Christians in the UK can respond. The following is an extract from the response of 'Embrace', the charity that some of us have supported in the past, and which works across the Middle East:

"The Lord is near the broken-hearted and saves the crushed in spirit." Ps 34:18

Dear Friends - We have watched with horror and heartbreak the events unfolding in the Holy Land. We pray for restraint and an end to the violence and have been in touch with our partners on the ground.

In Israel our partners are still trying to come to terms with the shock of the attacks and with the ongoing kidnap situation. They ask us:

"Please do keep praying for Israel! Our nation is bleeding. We are very grateful that you are thinking and praying about us! Israel will never be the same after this war."

Across Gaza there is huge devastation and fear. People have fled to churches and schools in the hope of safety. Our partner Al Ahli Hospital is providing emergency healthcare. But the air strikes, lack of electricity and water have meant all our projects in Gaza have had to pause and staff are seeking shelter where they can. Several have lost their homes in the bombing and one of our partner's training centres has been badly damaged.

They told us: "Amidst this horrible situation and the unprecedented damage, we turn our faces to you to hold the people of Gaza in your prayers."

As soon as they are able to work safely again, Embrace will be there to support our sisters and brothers as they respond to the fallout of the war and serve with expertise and compassion.
